REGC Keagle: Thank you Grand Officers for being here today and for all the work you guys have put in this year and the last several years for most of you. You can be seated.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on Sir Knight Bradley L. Baker, KTCH to present the Knights Templar Eye Foundation Report.

SK Baker: Right Eminent Sir, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation 51st Voluntary State Campaign ran from June 1st, 2018 thru May 15th, 2019. A total of \$1,065,463.00 was realized from this Campaign from contributions by Sir Knights and Commanderies. The Sir Knights of Illinois were generous and contributed \$22,553.00

and supporting donors were generous and contributed \$21,052.00 to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, totaling \$43.605.00. This placed Illinois 8th in the Grand Encampment in contributions. Our per capita contributions were \$13.15 per Sir Knight and placed us 26th in the Grand Encampment in that category. The above-mentioned contributions plus trusts and wills made the grand total for Illinois to be \$92,999.00 and the Grand Encampment's grand total to be \$1,756,414.00 which was received by the Knights Templar Eye Foundation during the 51st Voluntary State Campaign. First place in dollar contributions in Illinois was Elwood Commandery No. 6 with \$3,900.00. In first place in per capita contributions was also Elwood Commandery No. 6 with \$65.00 per member. Congratulations Sir Knights of Elwood Commandery No. 6.

There are two levels of awards we give out: one for \$10.00 or more per member and one for \$5.00 to \$9.99 per member. There are seven commanderies that contributed \$10.00 or more per member. These are – would a representative from each of these seven commanderies please come forward - Blaney Commandery No. 5, St. Bernard Commandery No. 35, Macomb Commandery No. 56, Silangan Commandery No. 93, Elwood Commandery No. 6, St. Aldemar Commandery No. 47, and Evanston Commandery No. 58. Thank you very much Commanderies. Those absent will be mailed their certificates.

There are thirteen commanderies that contributed from \$5.00 to \$9.99 per member. Each one of these commanderies will receive a certificate. I will read them off and I would like a member from each commandery to please come forward. Galesburg Commandery No. 8, Rock Island Commandery No. 18, DeMolay Commandery No. 24, Bethel Commandery No. 36, Mt. Olivet Commandery No. 38, Mizpah Commandery No. 53, Trinity Commandery No. 80, Urbana Commandery No. 16, Aurora Commandery No. 22, St. Omer Commandery No. 30, Melita Commandery No. 37, Tancred Commandery No. 50, and Quincy Commandery No. 77. Let us all give these commanderies a round of applause. Thank you very much.

I have a little bit more to finish in this report; before I finish, however, I forgot to introduce my friend who is helping me. Sir Knight Robert Bigley, GCT/EPC, who is the Administrator of the Knights Templar

Eye Foundation out of Texas. He is also a member and Past Commander of Bethel Commandery No. 36. Thank you, Robert, for being here today.

In concluding this report, I have some details. It is my pleasure to report that we had some extra ordinary donations this year, as follows: The Order of the Eastern Star Grand Chapter of Illinois gave us \$11,052.00. The Illinois Knights Templar Home gave us \$10,000.00 and the Trust of G. Wilbur Bell gave us almost \$50,000.00. These 3 donations are all part of the Illinois grand total of \$93,000.00.

I would like to mention the Sir Knights of Illinois, God bless you all, the Sir Knights and Commanderies gave \$22,000.00 and people who are not Sir Knights and are supporters of the Eye Foundation, one of whom has been dead for many years, gave us \$70,000.00. That is something to think about. We thank them. They might encourage all of us to look forward a little bit and be a bigger part of it. Attached in your handouts are spreadsheets of the whole Country showing Grand Commanderies and Commanderies.

I have one other item to do. A Sir Knight from Chicago purchased a Grand Master's Club. The price is \$1,000.00 and I know many of you in this room are holders of the Grand Master's Club. He asked if he could be presented his plaque and his acknowledgement jewel at this Session. He is a member of the only Pilipino Commandery in the United States of America as far as we know. These guys are very active Templars who meet in Chicago. They have a dinner before each meeting. I go to most of their meetings and I can assure you that the food is outstanding. I don't even know what they call it, but, boy is it good. So, I would like to invite all the members of Silangan Commandery No. 93 who are present to please come forward and, with Robert's help, I will make the presentation of the Grand Master's Club to Sir Knight Nicolas O. Sarabia, Sr., Generalissimo.

I would just like to say one more word, "these Sir Knights from Silangan Commandery No. 93 are so proud to be Knights Templars. Look how many came down. Show me a commandery that has 8 guys – what do they have? 7 - okay. This is the way they are. They meet, they get together, they have large meetings, they practice every meeting, they have uniforms, they have a golf outing every year to raise money for their commandery. It's unbelievable and we should all look at these guys and thank them for being a part of us."

With that, Right Eminent Sir, that ends our report and thank you for giving me the time.

REGC Keagle: Thank You.

June 1, 2018 to 2031. Now, this is just statistical here. Membership statistic: Grand Commandery's last return 43 Commanderies and Charters or Dispensations issued last year I didn't have it. Commanderies surrendering Charters last year 3, Chartered Commanderies to date 38, Membership as of 6/1/18 3,565, Knighted 68 which is a very low total, Affiliated 75. Reinstated 20, Adjusted 0, Total gain 163. Decreases: Demitted 172, Suspended 116. Deceased 140, Expelled 0. Adjusted 3. Total Loss 431.

Net Gains or Net Loss: Minus 268

Membership 5/31/19: 3297

Sir Knight Charles Alvin Brown (Circular No. 2), Right Eminent Grand Commander 1990 – 1991, born January 22, 1933, at rest February 13, 2019

Charles Alvin Brown was born January 22, 1933, to John and Vera Wright Brown at Wella, Missouri. The family moved to Illinois where he attended schools. Charles was in the Air Force from 1952 to 1955. During the Korean Conflict, after 6 months duty, he became an instructor at Chanute Airforce Base, Rantoul, Illinois. He married Margaret Galley August 2, 1952. He worked as a member of Local 150 as an Operating Engineer for many years. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church at Belvidere. He was involved in numerous community clubs including the United Methodist Church.

Charles loved spending time with his family and enjoyed attending sports events with his children and grandchildren. He also enjoyed gardening and fishing. Charles is loved dearly by his wife Vera, daughter Tammy, and son Lawrence Brown. Sisters Anita Jaeger, and Rebecca Keller, Grandchildren Charles Brown, Rachel Brown. Lawrence served as his Father's Grand Color Bearer in 1991. Active Brother in DeMolay in Wisconsin Chapter. REGC Keagle: Thank you Sir Knights.

REGC Keagle: I will now entertain the nomination for the Office of Eminent Grand Treasurer.

EGR Hoffman: Right Eminent Grand Commander, my name is H. Wayne Hoffman. I am a Past Eminent Commander of Peoria Commandery No. 3, Right Eminent Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of State of Illinois and soon to be past Eminent Grand Recorder of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. I would like to suggest the name of William E. Jegen for the Office of Eminent Grand Treasurer of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

REGC Keagle: Thank you.

REGC Keagle: Are there any other nominations for the Office of Eminent Grand Treasurer? Are there any other nominations? Are there any other nominations? Hearing none, I now declare the nominations be closed and a unanimous ballot be cast for Sir Knight William E. Jegen for the Office of Eminent Grand Treasurer of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

REGC Keagle: Sir Knight Jegen, do you accept?

EGT Jegen: I do.

REGC Keagle: Thank you. Congratulations, Bill.

REGC Keagle: I will now entertain the nomination for the Office of Eminent Grand Recorder.

SK Goff: Right Eminent Grand Commander, my name is Christopher Goff, I am Eminent Commander of Clinton Commandery No. 66 in Clinton, Illinois, and I would like to suggest the name of Sir Knight Mark Allen Keagle for the Office of Eminent Grand Recorder of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

REGC Keagle: Thank you. At this point and time, I will recuse myself and turn this over to the Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander, Sir Knight William Joseph Farris who is soon to be Right Eminent Grand Commander.

VEDGC Farris: Do I hear any other nominations for the Office of Eminent Grand Recorder? Are there any other nominations? Hearing none, I declare the nominations be closed and soon to be Past Right Eminent Grand Commander, Mark Allen Keagle, be elected to the Office of Eminent Grand Recorder of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

VEDGC Farris: Sir Knight Keagle, do you accept?

REGC Keagle: I do accept. Thank you.

REGC Keagle: Thank you Sir Knights. I will entertain the nomination for Eminent Grand Jr. Warden of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

SK McDorman: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I am Michael McDorman, Eminent Past Commander of Galesburg Commandery No. 8 . It is my honor and privilege to suggest the name of Jamie Allen Emery, EPC, KTCH, for the Office of Eminent Grand Jr. Warden of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

REGC Keagle: Thank you Sir Knight McDorman.

SK Barrett: Right Eminent Grand Commander, my name is Donald Barrett, Past Jr. Warden of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. It is my pleasure to suggest Joe Perone for the Office of Eminent Grand Jr. Warden of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. Thank you.

REGC Keagle: Thank you Sir Knight Barrett.

REGC Keagle: Are there any other nominations? Are there any other nominations? Are there any other nominations? I now declare the nominations closed.

REGC Keagle: Would Sir Knight Jamie and Sir Knight Joe please approach the East. Sir Knights, on your left and my right is Sir Knight Jamie Emery. On your right, my left, is Sir Knight Joe Perone. These two Sir Knights are well qualified for this position and we will vote using Ballot No. 1 for the Office of Eminent

Grand Jr. Warden of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. You can write in "Jamie" or "Joe".

REGC Keagle: Will the Officers in the West please collect the ballots. Joe and Jamie, you can sit down. I won't keep you up here.

REGC Keagle: Have all the Sir Knights who were entitled to vote voted? That being so, I declare the ballot closed. I now declare a short recess of the 163rd Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois and call upon Sir Knight Andrew E. Michyeta, GWB, for the annual meeting of the Knights Templar Home Corporation.

SK Michyeta: Good Morning. I want to welcome you to the annual meeting of the Illinois Knights Templar Home which is an Illinois Not For Profit Corporation doing business under the name of the Illinois Knights Templar Assistance Outreach. I once attended a seminar on the subject "How to Be a Good Board Member". The idea I came away with was that in a properly functioning organization, the only job the Chair had was to be a cheerleader. That was very true of this organization and of this board. If every member of the organization was doing their job, all that would be left for the Chair would be to be a cheerleader for the team and to, perhaps, even to push them on to work harder. This was the case with this board.

I would now like to introduce the members of the Board of the Illinois Knights Templar Home. First, I would like to introduce our Vice President, William Farris; and please hold your applause until they are all standing. The Secretary of our Board, Austin Smith; the Treasurer, William E. Jegen; the Second Division Rep, Jamie Emery, thank you Jamie; the Third Division Rep, Wendell Walch; the Fourth Division Rep, Jesse Johns; the Fifth Division Rep, Charles Hileman, Jr. Actually, the Chairman of the Governance Committee was John Sansone.

We will now have the Secretary read the minutes of our last Annual Meeting.

Good morning Sir Knights. I will make this very brief. The minutes I'm supposed to read were not printed in the book. I assure you, as Secretary of this Board, that they were taken accurately and were reported to the Board and approved by the Board. I move, Right Eminent Grand Commander, that the minutes be accepted as printed in the Proceedings.

I don't know how it happened, but the minutes - does anybody else, well, I move that the minutes of the last Annual Meeting be approved as written in most of the Annual Reports.

Second

All in favor vote by sword arm. All opposed. Motion passes. I'm sorry.

Drew, the minutes were recorded last year so I put them in the Report.

Okay, thank you. I don't know how that happened. I apologize. Okay, now that is over, I would now like to mention some of the individual effort contributed to the sustainability of the charity. The first and absolutely outstanding contribution, the James Madison of this charity was Chuck Hileman. His authorship of the new laws the structured the very nature of the continuation of the charity. It was his suggestion, at this Board's first meeting, that became the defining principle of all future considerations.

His concept, all actions taken by this Board should be taken to ensure the sustainability of the charity. Now, Chuck would you stand up. Please, a round of applause. Thank you, Chuck, for your contribution.

The next individual I would like to mention deserving an acclaim it is Austin Smith. In addition to being a tremendous Secretary, he initiated the charities to support the IMOS and carried it to successful conclusion and made the original contract with the Grand Encampment for this charity to be first thing of the Grand Commandery to establish their proposed "40 Mile Project". I want to thank you Austin. Please stand and everybody give Austin a round of applause.

The amount of work put in by all the members of this Board was really tremendous and the cooperation was more than anticipated.

The third major contribution was made by John Sansone. He developed our application form and the procedures to process the applications and the guidelines. John, would you stand up for your acclaim. Please.

Now, I would like to call upon our Treasurer, the person central to all our actions through applications of his skill, his enduring patience, his talent; and, no less important, his signature, William E. Jegen. I now call upon Bill for the Treasurer's Report.

Contained in the information that was available in the Preliminary Report, is a consolidated balance sheet for both the Illinois Knight Templar Home and the Illinois Knight Templar Home Endowment Fund which is a separate corporation. The total of that is in excess of \$10,000,000.00. It also contains a separate balance sheet on just the Administrative Fund which really is what the Illinois Knight Templar Home basically is. In addition to that Administrative Fund, which has all the investments, there is an Operating Fund with about \$80,000.00 in it. That is the wind up from the sale of the physical home itself. Whenever you wind down an operation that has gone on for fifty years, there is always lingering potential liabilities; particularly when you are dealing with Medicaid and Medicare because they don't sometimes complete their audits for two or three years. So, we maintain that account and will maintain it for probably at least until November of 2020 to pay any lingering obligations or billing to Medicaid, Medicare, or anything of that particular nature. It has been my pleasure to work with Drew and the Board and to the finances in order. We have had an audit completed for the previous year; tax returns were timely filed. The regulatory obligations, which you should understand, are substantial for a charity of this size. The audit requirements, filings with the Attorney General to maintain your status to solicit contributions, etc., and we have worked with outside professionals in an attempt to meet and satisfy all of those regulatory obligations and keep our charity in good standing. Thank you.

I now call for a move of the acceptance of Sir Knight Bill Jegen's Treasurer's Report.

So Moved

Second

All in favor, sword arm. All opposed. Thank you.

I might add one thing. Yesterday, on August 2nd, I got a telephone call from our Auditor and the statements to go to the Federal Government and AG Department are reconciled and they are going to

be submitted before August 15th. As far as I know, Bill, the only requirement is an additional check in the amount of \$545.00 to the AG Department for registration. I thought I would mention that.

I now call upon William Farris for the nomination and the election of the new First Division Representative to the Board.

Good afternoon, let's not do it again, should be Good morning. From the First Division, Apollo Commandery, I would like to nominate to the Board Sir Knight William Jegen. Do you accept Sir Knight Jegen? "Yes"

Thank you.

Okay, I'm sorry. This was kind of thrown on me at the last second. Are there any other nominations for the First Division Board? Are there any other nominations for the First Division Board?

Mr. President point of order. Being one of those who voted and created the bylaws for this Corporation, I'm quite sure that this is an appointment by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.

No.

The bylaws were amended when? July 22nd, 2018.

Obviously, I wasn't on the Board at that time. Look at Number 12.

Okay, Bill Jegen has been nominated by our incoming Right Eminent Grand Commander by the rules of the current bylaws. Now, I have to ask, "Are there any other nominations for the First Division Representative to the Illinois Knights Templar Home Board?" Are there any other nominations? Are there any other nominations?

There being no further nominations, I would suggest that one unanimous ballot be cast for William Jegen to serve as the First Division Representative to the Board of the Illinois Knights Templar Home. Move – Second

All in favor, all opposed.

Okay, we worked our way through that. Now, I would like to call for a motion to approve the actions of this Board for the past administrative year.

I so move - second

Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, it has been moved and seconded to approve the actions of the Board taken for the past administrative year. All in favor, sword arm. All opposed, bridle arm. The motion passes.

I would like to make one further announcement that is off script. We have given out over 90 of the Annual Reports. Each Annual Report contains an application for services to be rendered by this Home. That means you have 90 potential needy people who could be served. I want to emphasize the fact that this is your charity. The success of the charity is dependent upon the members of this organization

fulfilling their duty seeking out needy Sir Knights, their families and others as its stated in our mission. For this Board to complete its mission, it needs your cooperation.

Thank you. I now move for a motion to adjourn.

So moved - second - all in favor

I'm Frank Cline. I'm a four-time passed Eminent Commander of Hospitaller Commandery which is now St. Aldemar Commandery Number 47, the past Secretary of the Knight Templar Home Board and, currently, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Illinois. When the Grand Commandery came to us and asked for assistance so that we administer the Knight Templar Home outreach program, we asked for a list of members of the Illinois Knight Templar Organization. We have been denied that list and the answer to the request so far has been that the Grand Encampment won't allow us to have it. We have Knight Templars who belong in Illinois who we believe they belong to border states that the outreach program can help. We don't want to hear that some Knight Templar fell down and froze to death in his living room because the water pipes froze up and he was frozen to death on the floor or that he was denied any services because he wasn't an Illinois Mason but he is an Illinois Knight Templar. If we had a list of Illinois Knight Templars, we could help that person. Also, when we vet the applications, if they say they are an Illinois Knight Templar we don't have a list to verify that. We have to go to the Grand Recorder to find out who the Recorder is for that Commandery, get ahold of that person and wait for him to confirm that this person is a member. I would ask, while the Grand Encampment Officers are here, and I don't want to put anybody on the spot; if the Grand Encampment would be willing to provide our Grand Lodge with a list of Illinois Knight Templars, we're not going to use it for anything other than verifying outreach programs. We want to be able to help our fellow Masons, whether they're Illinois Masons or not but they are Illinois Knight Templars. So, if we could get that resolved this weekend, it would be great and would save our staff hours of time and the Knight Templars would be served more promptly. Thank you.

Robert Bigley-

Yes, I would like to respond to that because I'm in the middle of this conversation. The MMS System has rules and regulations that we have guaranteed to all jurisdictions as to how the list will be managed. I could tell you this, "Illinois is not any different than Ohio and other states that have homes like this." It is not like you are getting 15 requests a day. Every other state calls the Grand Recorder and they ask for that permission. Therefore, the Grand Encampment could not release a printed list of templars to a body that is not a Grand Commandery body. That decision is how the MMS System contracts or negotiated with the licensing agreement that the list would not be shared with outside organizations. So, I'll be willing to have a meeting later on; but I can tell you that I was very much involved in this decision with the Grand Master and all the Grand Encampment Officers. Okay?

I just want to thank Sir Knight Bigley for that explanation because what happens is that rumors get started and, well, because the Grand Encampment doesn't like so and so they won't release it. Or, you know, they don't like the Grand Lodge of Illinois, so they won't release it. I wanted everybody to hear Brother Bigley's explanation. This is the first I've heard it from the source. So, we've pretty much got it resolved. Thank you.

REGC Keagle: Thank you.

Now, we have a motion on the floor to adjourn.

Second – it's already been seconded, now it's been seconded a second time. All in favor, sword arm. All opposed. There being no opposition, I declare the meeting adjourned.

REGC Keagle: I now call the 163rd Conclave of the State of Illinois Knights Templar reconvened.

REGC Keagle: I call on the members of the Jurisprudence Committee . Do we have an election?

MEPGM Jones: I am happy to announce that you have elected Sir Knight Jamie Emery.

REGC Keagle: Congratulations Sir Knight Jamie Emery. Will you accept the position of Eminent Grand Jr. Warden?

SK Emery: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I do accept. Thank you.

MEPGM Jones: May we have permission to destroy the ballots?

REGC Keagle: You are directed to destroy the ballots. Thank you.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on Sir Knight Smith for a report of the By-Laws Committee.

EGG Smith: Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Master. Good morning Sir Knights. I have had some good news for a change. I am the Chairman of your Bylaws Committee and I would like to give you the names of the other members. Sir Knight Charles E. Hileman, Jr., Right Eminent Past Grand Commander; Sir Knight William E. Jegen, Right Eminent Past Grand Commander; Sir Knight William E. Jegen, Right Eminent Past Grand Commander; Sir Knight Eminent Past Grand Commander; Sir Knight Eminent Past Grand Commander; To the Grand Commander; Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the great State of Illinois, your Committee is pleased to make the report.

Three Commanderies have submitted revisions to their existing bylaws. These Commanderies are as follows: Beaumanoir No. 9, St. Aldemar No. 47, Tancred No. 50. After some minor revisions by your Committee, and resubmission by those Commanderies, it is my pleasure to report that these bylaws conform to the uniform bylaws content and format as outlined in the Constitution and Bylaws of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. Your committee finds no reason to disapprove the requested changes. They are all approved. That is my report.

I move that my report be accepted.

So moved

Second

REGC Keagle: The Report of the Bylaws Committee has been moved and seconded for acceptance. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed, the bridle arm. The motion passes.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on Sir Knight William Jackson Jones, Most Eminent Past Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the USA for the Jurisprudence Report.

MEPGM Jones: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I believe the Jurisprudence Report was in the Preliminary Proceedings and I move that it be accepted.

REGC Keagle: It has been moved to accept the Report of the Jurisprudence Committee. Is there a second?

Second

REGC Keagle: The move has been seconded to accept the Report of the Jurisprudence Committee. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed, the bridle arm. The report is accepted.

MEPGM Jones: Would you like to do the legislation at this time?

REGC Keagle: I would Most Eminent Past Grand Master.

MEPGM Jones: Okay. We can do this the long way or the short way. I heard a long way guy. Don't you have to go to the bathroom? Okay, the short way is the Bylaws of the Grand Encampment were changed at the last Triennial Conclave and these first items bring us into compliance or concordance with the Bylaws of the Grand Encampment which basically allows us to have a business meeting with five Sir Knights of the institution present along with and including one of the dais officers. That reduces that from nine to five. It still says we have to have nine for the Order of the Temple and other ceremonial meetings. Does everybody understand that? Okay. I move that that portion of the legislation be approved then.

REGC Keagle: It has been moved and seconded to accept that portion of the legislation. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed, the bridle arm. That portion of the legislation is approved.

MEPGM Jones: Okay. The next section allows each Commandery to have their stated annual conclave in either May or June. This will aid the Grand Recorder and other interested parties to get the reports in time for the conclave. Is there any discussion on that? Anybody have any questions? I move that this portion of the report be accepted.

REGC Keagle: It has been moved and seconded to accept this portion of the legislation. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed, the bridle arm.

That portion of the legislation is approved.

MEPGM Jones: Okay. The next section corrects some of our grammar and other phrasing that only changes the wording. I move this portion be accepted.

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion to approve this portion of the legislation. Is there a second? A motion has been made and seconded this portion of the legislation. Is there any discussion? All in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed, the bridle arm. This portion of the legislation is approved.

MEPGM Jones: Okay. We used to have insurance. The Grand Commandery had insurance for all of the commanderies. We no longer have that and, so, the next section just deletes all of the information regarding who paid and how much they paid, etc. Since we don't collect insurance anymore, we don't need that. I move the acceptance of this portion of the report.

REGC Keagle: It's been moved and seconded to accept this portion of the report. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed, the bridle arm. This portion of the legislation is approved.

MEPGM Jones: Sir Knight Hileman, has brought to my attention that I missed one section – Section 459 of the Statutes of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. I don't want to read it. We feel it is best to do this and correct any errors that we have made in the past. I move that the adoption of this portion of the legislation report be accepted.

REGC Keagle: It has been moved and seconded that this portion of the legislative report be accepted. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed, the bridle arm. This portion is approved.

MEPGM Jones: Okay, just to keep everybody happy, I would like to move the adoption of all the legislation that we have approved piece meal.

REGC Keagle: There's been a motion made and seconded for approval of the legislation as a whole. Is there any discussion?

REPGC Hermann: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I'm Gary D. Hermann, Past Eminent Commander of Joliet Commandery No. 4. If amended, Section 438 would read in essence, I'm not going to go through it again, but I would like to have them strike "ensuring against negligence acts of a commandery, its fosters, members while performing work or business." A general liability policy does not cover that portion of insurance. You need D&O coverage. That would cost each commandery approximately \$9,000 dollars. That's what D&O costs. So, I would recommend you strike that and also add "to include hired and non-owned auto." You would have a definite exposure with hired and non-owned auto. If a person goes on any mission from a commandery and has an accident, that commandery can be sued. I can give you a lot of illustrations where silly things happened. But you definitely need hired and non-owned auto and you need to strike that other part. Otherwise, it's going to cost the commanderies at least \$9,000 and you're going to have to have that owned and non-owned auto. So, you're talking over \$9,000 per commandery.

REGC Keagle: Thank you Sir Knight Hermann. Is there any other discussion?

REGC Keagle: Was that a motion to amend?

REPGC Hermann: Yes

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion made to amend. Sir Knight Hermann, would you read what your amended proposal would be.

REPGC Hermann: On this section of the report under 438A would read you come down and it says \$1,000,000 and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate and then strike out "ensuring against negligent acts of the commandery its officers and members while performing work for business of the commandery." That's what you want to strike out because, otherwise, your falling into an area not covered by general liability, its only covered by D&O. And then, you have no mention in there of hired and non-owned auto and you definitely have a big exposure under hired and non-owned auto. I can go back, I remember years ago when I was a Grand Commandery Officer, we had a Grand Commandery Officer who did not have liability insurance and he was traveling around the State inspecting commanderies and all it took was one accident. If he showed that he was supposed to be there, we would have been sued and we had no coverage. I presume it is still under the Grand Commandery policy.

REPGC Hileman: State it the way you want it to read.

REPGC Hermann: Pardon?

REPGC Hileman: State it the way you want it to read exactly.

REPGC Hermann: Each constituent commandery shall carry property insurance on its paraphernalia equipment and other property as listed on the Annual Report in inventory in such amounts

recommended by the Finance Board and general liability insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 for occurrence and \$2,000,000 for its annual aggregate.

REPGC Hileman: Gary, you want a period there?

REPGC Hermann: Period

REPGC Hileman: Strike everything else?

REPGC Hermann: This policy should also include hired and other non-owned auto in the same amount.

MEPGM Jones: I think we've got it.

REGC Keagle: So, Sir Knights, you've heard the amendment, is there a second?

Second

REGC Keagle: Is there any discussion? All of those in favor of approving this amendment, vote by use of the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed, the bridle arm. The amendment passes. We have to approve the motion then.

REGC Keagle: Okay, we are voting on the amended wording in Section 438A.

REGC Keagle: It's been moved and seconded to approve the motion as amended. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by use of the sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed, the bridle arm. The motion is approved as amended.

MEPGM Jones: Thank you. I believe that takes care of it Right Eminent Grand Commander.

REGC Keagle: I believe we had a motion on the floor to approve all the legislation as a whole. There's been a motion made and seconded to approve all the legislation that was presented. Any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by use of the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed, the bridle arm. The motion to approve the legislation as a whole is approved.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on Sir Knight Wayne Clark for the report of the Ritual and Tactics Instruction Committee.

EGSW Clark: Good morning Sir Knights. The Ritual and Tactics Committee has been busy this past year implementing the Right Eminent Grand Commander's vision for an Original Tactics Certification Program. The Program is designed to recognize those Sir Knights who can demonstrate proficiency in ritual and tactics and the Commander, Generalissimo, Captain General, Sr. and Jr. Wardens, including the Hermits and Guards and the Prelate and the West. When you feel ready to test, you simply contact an elected Grand Commandery Officer or a Past Grand Commandery who will recommend you to the Ritual and Tactics Committee for examination. Once you are certified, you will be awarded with a cord to be worn on your uniform. If you certify in multiple positions, you will be awarded a cord intertwined with the appropriate colors. To that end, there were five schools conducted in the fall in each of the five divisions that helped Sir Knights prepare for the certification and to take that knowledge back to their commanderies to teach their fellow Sir Knights and, perhaps, attempt certification.

In addition to that, there was a proposal for a short form opening that was worked on. It would require only five Sir Knights to open: the Commander, the Warder, the Wardens and the Sentinel. All communications of the word and signs will remain the same as a full short form opening. All that will be permitted at stated meetings and special meetings. It is not intended for Annual Inspections and may not be permitted in case of emergency but could include the rehearsal of duties. The proposed short form opening has been posted to the Grand Commandery web site for a few months now. If you have not had a chance to take a look at it, I would suggest that you do.

So, as far as the Ritual and Certification Program, we did have three Sir Knights who certified. If they are in the room, will they please approach the East and face the West: Sir Knight Dan Coward, Sir Knight Walter Dement and Sir Knight Bradley Baker.

In addition, the Ritualistic and Tactics Committee also conducted four schools in the North Central and Southern Regions that helped Sir Knights with their ritual and tactics.

Right Eminent Grand Commander, I move the adoption of the Report of the Ritualistic and Tactics Committee.

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion to approve the adoption of the Report of the Ritualistic and Tactics Committee. Is there a second?

Second

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion and seconded to approve the adoption of the Report of the Ritualistic and Tactics Committee. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed, the bridle arm. The report is approved. Thank you.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on Sir Knight William Jegen for the Treasurer's Report.

EGT Jegen: In your Preliminary Proceedings is the report as well as the numbers. I would like to just give a quick explanation. The funding of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois is primarily through its per capita; but, it also has some investments and two that you may call "sustaining" funds. One is named the Jones Permanent Fund whereby half of the income from that fund is available. The other is the Graff Memorial Fund whereby all of the income of that fund is available. The donated amounts in the Graff Memorial Fund are restricted. Only the income can be spent. In the Jones Permanent Fund, it's the donated amount plus one half of the accruing income that is restricted and not available. These funds have been in place for about fifteen years. We have never drawn money on either one, so they are continuing to accumulate for the future security of this Grand Commandery.

In addition, the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois owns investment funds in its General Account of approximately \$150,000.00 that is invested at Raymond James in mutual funds and various securities.

The Income VS Expense Statement appears in the Proceedings Report and shows that the expenses were \$5,316.00 less than the income on an accrual basis. Following that is the Balance Sheet of just the

operating funds of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. Primary checking is done at Tremont Bank at the present. We have the investments with Raymond James. You will see some liabilities set forth there. In essence, those are bills that came in at the end of the year that checks had not yet been written until the month of July. They are shown, as of June 30th, a liability. In round numbers, the balance of funds for the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois is in operations of \$188,000.00. You also have a charitable fund, the Phillips Charity Fund, resulting from a 1978 bequest. It has a minimum restricted amount of \$116,114.98. The income above that amount can be used to fund various Masonic charities. It generally is used to support the Masonic Youth Organizations: DeMolay, Rainbow, and Job's Daughters.

This year's report from that committee recommended \$2,000.00 be given to each of those three charities. The checks were delivered by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.

In addition, I think this affects something coming up. The Grand Commandery maintains a separate Holy Land Pilgrimage Fund where, typically, the donations from Devine Service are put in that fund. Others are encouraged and do make donations to that fund. In one instance, a \$2,400.00 donation was made in the form of an endowment fund and is restricted so that the income only from that portion can be used for sending the ministers to The Holy Land. The bottom line is, you have approximately \$10,500.00 available to send ministers to The Holy Land. I understand that the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee has approved two applications and they will discuss that.

Any questions will be entertained at this time. I do want to point out to you that we hired an accounting firm, as we noted in the Proceedings Report, to review the records of 2018. They basically issued a clean slate upon their review. They have also assisted me in preparing the three tax returns for the last three years that will be used in filing Form 1024 concerning our tax-exempt status. Any questions?

Thank you, Right Eminent Grand Commander.

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion made to approve the Treasurer's Report. Is there a second? There has been a motion made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by the sword arm. Down Hands. Those opposed, the bridle arm. The motion is approved.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on Sir Knight Max Guthrie for the Finance Report.

SK Guthrie: Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers and Sir Knights of Illinois, the Finance Committee's report and the budget for next year were distributed to you. You should have picked them up outside. They are separate from the stated reports and there are two documents here. One is a written report of the Committee and one will be the budget for 2019 – 2020. I'll just comment about the report of the Finance Committee. The Finance Committee functions throughout the year. We review the various transactions as they are occurring or, shortly, before they occur in the case of disbursements because we approve the vouchers for payment. You will see, in our written report, the listing of those transactions there. Those are vouchers that represent not necessarily single transaction items, but a voucher could have three or four items on it at one time. There is a fair amount of that type of activity. It could be also that it doesn't overlap or supplant functions of the Investment Committee; but we do monitor those investments and watch how things are proceeding. On Wednesday July 31st, the Committee met in session to review and approve a budget for presentation today. By a vote of 3 to 0, the Committee approves this budget as printed for you for consideration for today and we would ask that you adopt it as the budget for 2019 – 2020. I'll state here that the total revenues that you see there

are \$21,298.00. Down below, the budgeted expenses would be \$71,249.00. The one figure that is missing is the over under. It didn't appear at the bottom; but, the budgeted excess of revenue over expense is \$49.00.

Right Eminent Grand Commander, I would move the approval of our report and the budget for next year.

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion made and seconded to accept the report of the Finance Committee and the budget for 2019 -2020. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by the sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed, the bridle arm. The motion is approved.

REGC Keagle: Thank you Sir Knight Guthrie.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on Sir Knight Joseph W. Lucas for the Investment Committee Report.

REPGC Lucas: The Investment Report is printed in the Preliminary Proceedings.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on the Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander, William J. Farris, to present the Inspection and Division grades.

VEDGC Farris: Good afternoon Sir Knights. I inspected the First Division this year, which was my last Division to inspect. I had a great time through all the years inspecting all the Divisions. I met a lot of really, really great people. I had a good time doing it. I will be at more inspections but not in that capacity. In the First Division, the top score was Joliet Commandery No. 4. The Second Division was Dixon Commandery No. 21. The Third Division was DeMolay Commandery No. 24 and the Fourth Division was Constantine Commandery No. 51. The point system was a little different this year. You got points for evening work and you also got points for assisting other Commanderies. The maximum points would have been 100 but you could gain a few points by doing it. We do have a problem though. We are supposed to give out streamers for the top Commanderies. Last year, the Very Eminent Grand Commander gave me the box of streamers to safeguard. I put them in a very secure place. I just don't remember where that secure place is. I tore my house up and down. I know I have them because I don't throw anything away. I'm kind of a packrat. But I will find it and I will personally present these streamers to each one of these Commanderies in the ensuing Templar Year. I want to thank all of you very much. I want to thank the Inspecting Officers for their help. I move that this report be accepted.

REGC Keagle: A motion has been made and seconded to accept the report of the Inspecting Officers. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by the Sword Arm. Down hands. Those opposed, the bridle arm. The motion carried. I'm sure, Bill, you will hand deliver those streamers.

VEDGC Farris: I will hand deliver them. Thank you very much.

REGC Keagle: Bill, you might as well stay down there. I'll call on you for the Report of the Charters and Dispensations.

VEDGC Farris: Charters and Dispensations. A Charter was made authorizing Beaumanoir Commandery No. 9, located at 221 West William Street, Decatur, Illinois, to temporarily move the stated meetings for

the Templar Year to South Macon Lodge, 221 South Front Street, Macon, Illinois. Authorized by Right Eminent Grand Commander Mark Keagle

A Dispensation was issued to Rock Island Commandery No. 18, located at 1800 South Avenue, Moline, Illinois, to move the September stated meeting to 1200 South East Street, Monmouth, Illinois.

A Charter was granted authorizing Patton Commandery No. 69, located at 124 North Tenth Street, Mt. Vernon, Illinois, to hold a special election for the office of Recorder and any other vacancies created through the action at the next stated meeting. Authorized by Right Eminent Grand Commander Mark Keagle.

A Dispensation was issued to authorize Belvidere Commandery No. 2, located at 1513 Washington Avenue, Alton, Illinois to move the December stated meeting from 12/12/18 to 12/17/18.

A Dispensation was issued authorize St. Elmo Commandery No. 64 located at 6910 West Grand Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, to move the January stated meeting from 1/1/19 to 1/15/19 due to the New Year holiday.

A Dispensation authorizing Hospitaller Commandery No. 31, located at 345 West College Street, Jacksonville, Illinois, to merge with St. Aldemar Commandery No. 47, located at 125 South Fifth Street, Petersburg, Illinois. For the merger, it shall be known as St. Aldemar Commandery No. 47, located at 125 South Fifth Street, Petersburg, Illinois.

A Dispensation was issued authorizing St. Elmo Commandery No. 64, located at 6910 West Grand Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, to move the location of the Charter to 41st Avenue, Riverside, Illinois. Also authorizing St. Elmo Commandery No. 64 to move the stated meetings to the first Tuesday of each month with the exception of July and August.

A Dispensation was issued authorizing Belvidere Commandery No. 2, located at 1513 Washington Avenue, Alton, Illinois, to move the March stated meeting from 3/13/19 from 7:00 pm to 3/13/19 6:00 pm

Two Charters were arrested. Albertus Magnus Commandery No. 92 was arrested and Pilgrim Commandery. Both of those have surrendered their Charters.

There was a Dispensation at Kewanee where it merged with Galesburg.

I ask that these Dispensations be approved.

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion moved to approve the report of the Charters and Dispensations Committee. Is there a second?

REGC Keagle: A motion has been made and seconded to approve the report of the Charters and Dispensations Committee. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor, vote by use of the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed, the bridle arm. The report is accepted. Thank you, Bill.

VEDGC Farris: Report of the Fiscal Officer's Fund. The Fiscal Officer's Fund is held as a separate investment account with Raymond James. It was established to help make claims by constituent commanderies should any Officer misappropriate funds. This provides commanderies protection against malfeasance or misfeasance by financial officers. There have been no claims to this fund and contributions to this fund have been discontinued. There is approximately \$55,000 in the Fiscal Officer's Fund. I, William Farris, respectfully submit that this report be approved.

REGC Keagle: A motion has been made to accept the Report of the Fiscal Officer's Fund. Is there a second?

REGC Keagle: A motion has been made and seconded to accept the Report of the Fiscal Officer's Fund. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor, vote by use of the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed, the bridle arm. The report is accepted. Thank you, Bill.

REGC Keagle: I would like to call on Sir Knight Jesse Johns for a report on the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee.

REPGC Johns: Good morning Sir Knights. I'm Jesse Johns and I'm the Chairman of the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee. Our basic report is in the printed minutes, but I have a little addition I would like to bring before this august body. I just now presented a check for \$412.00 for the Holy Land Pilgrimage accomplished through donations from our Ascension Service at Alto Pass. In the years we have had the Ascension Service, we have donated almost \$3,000.00 to the Holy land Pilgrimage. As Chairman of the Committee, we review the applications and we make recommendations for the pastors that we select to take the Holy Land Pilgrimage trip. One thing that has really come to my attention and breaks my heart, in a way, and I would like to see us change that today. In the past, historically, and why I don't know, I have asked several people and they don't know either. The local Commandery must monetarily support the pastor from his city to J.F.K. Airport. I don't know why this has been done in the past. It also bothers me that in doing this, the small commanderies, which are many and a big portion of our Organization, don't have the money to send a pastor from their Commandery area. I'm wondering why we hinder these small commanderies in sending a pastor to the Holy Land. There are several ways sending a pastor to the Holy Land can be funded. I would propose that we try to raise more money through several different ways. I will tell you why in just a moment. We have charities in our Organization that could put money into that. We have the Phillips Charity Fund; we have the Endowment Fund; I'm sure there are other funds we could draw from to put money into the Holy Land Pilgrimage. This would help us get a better representation of pastors from all areas of Illinois. I propose that we find ways to put money into the Holy Land Pilgrimage. This would be somewhat like we do the Eye Foundation. This would enable us to send more pastors to the Holy Land from Illinois. The idea is so that small commanderies – let's make it even – all commanderies. I don't know why we make that restriction, but I make the motion that we eliminate that restriction. If you read Mark's allocution, this is his number four recommendation to do this. I would make a motion that we agree to have the Grand Commandery support the total amount to send a pastor to Israel. I don't think there is anything we can do here that is more important than to promote Christianity. I feel, as a whole, we have not done that, and I would like to see us do that. So, my motion is to have the Grand Commandery fund the entire trip for our candidates to the Holy Land. I would put that in the form a motion right now that we find other ways to fund the Holy Land Pilgrimage.

Second.

EGR Hoffman: My name is H. Wayne Hoffman, Eminent Past Commander of Peoria Commandery No. 3. We only need to pay the amount from their town to LaGuardia. We don't pay all the way to Israel do we? That's what your motion said.

REPGC Johns: Now, it's just to New York but we want to go all the way with it.

EGR Hoffman: No, you only want to take them to LaGuardia. You don't want to take them all the way because the Grand Encampment pays to

REPGC Johns: I understand that; but, I understand we pay to JFK and back. What I'm saying is pay the whole bill through fund raisers, through charities, etc.

REGC Keagle: Thank you Sir Knight Hoffman.

REPGC Schlosser: Right Eminent Grand Commander, my name is Russell Schlosser, Eminent Past Grand Commander of this Grand Commandery. When the minister is approved, he picks up his airplane ticket at LaGuardia and is flown to Israel and is then housed and fed and transported around the trip and flown back to LaGuardia. The expenses that the Chairman is recommending is number one, getting your minister to Chicago. Flying to Chicago or having to drive to Chicago. There's and overnight stay so that he can pick up the flight from Chicago and go to LaGuardia. There may be an overnight charge at LaGuardia, depending upon the schedule. Now, the Grand Encampment for the pilgrimage pays for everything from LaGuardia thru but there are no personal monies allotted him for any other expenses outside the trip. So, usually, the expenses that we're looking at are transportation and overnight stay at Chicago to fly to LaGuardia to wait for his plane. Any personal expenses that you may want him to have such as souvenirs, any particular photographs of his trip, and then when he gets back to LaGuardia any accommodations necessary to get back to Chicago and then back to his home. Depending upon where you're located, this could be as much as \$800 to \$1,000. So, that's again, one of the reasons that the Chairman to say that a Commandery that doesn't have that kind of money may hesitate to recommend a minister. A minister who can't afford to go to the Holy Land doesn't have the money to make those necessary expenses. What he's recommending, and what I support, is that we create inside our allotment not just the selection of the minister but the associated monies necessary to pay those expenses outside of what a free trip always cost.

REGC Keagle: Thank you Sir Knight Schlosser. Is there any other discussion? Just so we're clear, what we are voting on is for this program to expand and encompass the burden that now, apparently, falls on the constituent commandery to transport the candidate for the program to LaGuardia to accompany the Grand Encampment in the program. So, is everybody clear on that?

REGC Keagle: Is there any other discussion? All those in favor, vote by the use of the sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed, the bridle arm. I believe the motion is approved.

REPGC Johns: Thank you Right Eminent Grand Commander. I appreciate that very much. Like I said the majority of our report is in the preprinted cases.

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion moved to approve the Report of the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee. Is there a second?

REGC Keagle: A motion has been made and seconded to accept the Report of the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee. Is there any discussion?

SK: I have a question. These names that you have listed here in the Report, have they been approved?

REPGC Johns: No, not yet. I have talked with both of them.

SK: Why do you want to put names in a report if they haven't been approved? And the one here that shows the age; I doubt whether that complies with the requirements of the Holy Land Pilgrimage Program. That there has to be a certain number of years left on preaching.

REPGC Johns: That has not been approved. It's gone to the Committee. These are the two applications we are looking at.

SK: I move that the Report be amended to strike the names.

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion made to amend the Report to strike the names from the Report that was printed. Is there a second?

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion made to strike the names from the Report that was printed. Any discussion? All those in favor, vote by use of the sword arm. Down hand. Those opposed, the bridle arm. The motion to amend is approved.

REGC Keagle: Now, we will go back to the motion to approve the Report of the Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee as amended. All those in favor, vote by use of the Sword Arm. Down hands. Those opposed, the bridle arm. The motion is approved.

REGC Keagle: Sir Knight Farris, will you take over from here?

REGC Keagle: Sir Knights, I made a goal to be done by 11:00 a.m. today. We didn't quite hit it so I'll cut my remarks and try to get us out of here as quickly as we can.

REGC Keagle: I want to welcome all the Grand Officers, Distinguished Guests and all the Sir knights to the 163rd Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. It is my hope that you have enjoyed the hospitality and fellowship.

Most Worshipful Grand Master Clark, Right Eminent Deputy Grand Master Johnson, Right Eminent Deputy Department Commander Pugh, Most Eminent Past Grand Master Jones, Right Eminent Past Department Commander DeHeer and Right Eminent Past Department Cronk we are truly honored with your presence here today.

I have a couple recommendations:

The Ritual and Tactics Committee Certification Program should continue. This will ensure that the tactics are consistently taught throughout the State.

I recommend the Grand Recorder should maintain a list of names of every commandery's life members.

I recommend the annual returns of the constituent commanderies should be streamlined to eliminate unnecessary information. The per capita amount should be calculated at the Grand Recorder's office and then billed to the commanderies.

In conclusion, at the time when I started the journey through the Grand Commandery Line, we implemented a 5-year plan with specific goals.

The first goal we set was to have all commanderies financially sound. This has a mixed result. While we increased the required dues for every commandery, we may not have increased them enough. Many commanderies still struggle to have the financial stability to do anything except pay their per capita and the rent. I would encourage the Grand Officers and local officers to continue to look for ways to build the finances of the local commanderies. Part of the goal was to maintain and better understand the business side of the commanderies. I believe at the Grand level, we have made many strides in cleaning up some of the business that may have been unpleasant and pushed to the side. At the local level, I think we still have work to do. The Grand Commandery should continue to work with the local commanderies to help them better understand their business.

The next goal was to have quality, committed officers installed in every commandery. This is an evergrowing task that should continue to be monitored. We have encouraged this with the high inspection scores streamer, the Cross and Crown Award, the scoring system for the inspections and the continued use of the Green and Gold Certificates. The goal of a committed officer goes hand-in-hand with the goal of performing the highest quality Orders anywhere in the world. To accomplish this, we first must instruct the work the same way everywhere. We implemented a Certified Ritual Program which will ensure that the instructors who certify have demonstrated that they know the correct tactics and can instruct others. This year, I have asked for the Ritual and Tactics Committee to run the schools throughout the State. They have also met several times and discussed and laid the foundation for the program. I would like to thank Sir Knight Richard Carnall for committing his time to travel and teach the schools. I would like to give a special "thank you" to Sir Knight Wayne Clark and the Committee for all the hard work they have put in this year. I don't think I can remember a time when more was asked of a committee than what I asked of you.

The fourth and fifth goals are both membership driven. We set a goal to get good quality members, not just numbers. I think we are on the correct path. As I have traveled around the State, I have seen many new Sir Knights stepping in and taking an active role in their commanderies. With these new members, we need to do a better job of educating and communicating with them. The Grand Commandery has fallen short on this goal. We, as Grand Officers, need to do a better job and look for new ways to communicate with the membership. The website has made strides in this area; but we still need to do better. We also need to look for alternative ways to communicate with our younger demographic. I encourage every Sir Knight to bring your ideas to the Grand Commandery Officers.

I would like to thank all the Sir Knights of Illinois for allowing me to serve you as Grand Commander of Illinois. I have traveled all over this State and could have not felt more welcome. I have enjoyed the last several years getting to know many of you and I look forward to the continued relationship.

I also extend a thank you from my Ladies. You have always treated them like family every place they have gone.

I would like to thank Jesse and Kim Johns for the work and support you have given me and to Hank and Patty DeHeer for your continued counsel and encouragement. If it were not for Hank, I would not have started on this journey. I would like to thank Joe Lucas for being my travel companion on many occasions and always having to counsel me on doing it the correct way and not the Clinton Commandery way. I would like to thank all the current and past officers that I served with. I would like to thank all the ladies who helped and supported my Lady and the Grand Commandery. I have always enjoyed spending time with all of you.

This is hard for me to say, but I would like to thank my Mother-in-Law, Becky White; or, as she is more affectionately known in my house as "Grandma the Witch". I would like to thank her for all she has done for me and my family. She spent many weekends with Natalie as Sarah and I traveled around the State. If it was not for her, I wouldn't have been able to do this.

Lastly, I would like to thank my Ladies Sarah and Natalie. I thank you both for allowing me on this journey. I know you spent many nights and weekends without me and I hope you're proud.

I would like to leave you all with this one question. This question has haunted me ever since I read it. I've lived my life trying to answer it. It is a question that I try to answer not only from the sacrifice that was given to us as all Christians, but as people who are protected by our military men and women. This question comes from Donald Stratton and his book, "All the Gallant Men". Mr. Stratton was severely burned as a sailor on the U.S.S. Arizona on December 7, 1941. He asked this question, "Of all the questions we could ask of God in times of war from the protection we asked of our loved ones to the clarification we ask to the why of it all, there is one question we should not direct to him but to ourselves. Am I worth dying for? Am I worth the sacrifice for who they were and would someday become?"

Thank you Sir Knights .

I move for the acceptance of this Report.

VEDGC Farris: The motion has been made and seconded to accept the Right Eminent Grand Commander's allocution. Is there any discussion? Hearing none, it's approved.

REGC Keagle: Right Eminent Grand Recorder, do we have any further business we need to cover?

EGR Hoffman: No

EGT Jegen: Right Eminent Grand Commander, if it be in order, I would move that the Report of the Investment Committee be printed in the Proceedings as received although it was not distributed.

REGC Keagle: There has been a motion made to accept the Report of the Investment Committee that was submitted but not printed. Is there a second? There has been a motion made and seconded to accept the Report of the Investment Committee that was submitted but not printed. Is there any discussion? There being no discussion, all those in favor vote by the sword arm. Down Hands. Those opposed, the bridle arm. The motion is approved.

REGC Keagle: I would now like to call on Right Eminent Department Commander Sir Knight Gerald Pugh.

REDC Pugh: Thank you Right Eminent Grand Commander. Good morning Sir Knights. I won't keep you long, just a couple of things. The Knight Templar Eye Program. You know how many is a percentage in Illinois. We have three commanderies at 100 percent by sponsors. You have 16 commanderies with 50 percent or above. For the East Central, it's 56.9 percent. In Illinois, it's 55.6 percent which is very good, but you can do better. I would hope that you focus on this. You know, when you go to East Central and you see a doctor that comes in and this doctor is from a children's hospital out in California and Los Angeles and he talks about what the Knight Templar Eye Foundation has done for him and for the patients that he sees. Do you know that every government grant is started by the Knight Templar Eye Foundation? Every one of them. That's something that you should be very proud of. We help children to see. This doctor told a story of a young child that came to him and they were going to have to remove her eyes because of cancer in the eyes. He decided that, because of the Knight Templar Eye Foundation and the studies that he was able to do, he saved that child's eyes and he saved her sight and she can see today. That's because of you. That's because of your contributions. So, please try to talk you commanderies into; everyone should be a life sponsor. The average age in this state is 66.7 years old. That's not bad. Do you know that 18 percent are 39 or younger; so that makes 82 percent who are 50 or older. But 35 percent are between the ages of 50 and 69. That's where we should be focusing to try to find our leaders. It's great to have young men, don't get me wrong. It's great to have a young man involved. However, is he going to stay involved? He's got so many other things, especially like a wife, children. We should be focused on that group of men. York Rite Emergent Leaders Program – we both opened it up to the ladies and we also opened it to those who are not Knights Templar and there

was a question that was asked about the youth and Grand Master Jeff Nelson has decided that any of the youth who want to go through this program should have a sponsor to make sure they're mature enough to go through the program. We have given out a lot of pamphlets. You don't have to be recommended anymore by the way. If you want to go, just see one of the Grand Commandery Officers. They have all the literature and it is always the second week in March. I want to thank Illinois for all of the support for the last East Central Conference. We had a dynamite conference and I'm very proud that it's because of you we had the largest attendance ever on Saturday night. I was very proud of it and I was proud of this Department. Grand Commander, thank you for all the courtesies and hospitality given to me and I'll turn it back over to you. Thank you, Sir Knights.

REGC Keagle: It is now my pleasure to introduce Sir Knight Michael Burke Johnson, Right Eminent Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America.

REDGM Johnson: Thank you Sir Knights, sit down. I know many of you need to go to the bathroom and I'm included. REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER

To the Officers and Members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois,

The Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois has the following funds, accounts and investments:

General Checking Account. This checking account is at Tremont Bank and is used for payment of Grand Commandery Bills and as a pass-through account for the other special accounts, such as the Life Membership Account and Phillips Charity Fund Account.

Triennial Savings Account. This account is also at Tremont Bank, and the annual payments for Triennial Expenses are deposited into this account and every third year Triennial Expenses are withdrawn from this account. The Grand Treasurer recommends that this account be discontinued, and the proceeds invested in the General Investment Account at Raymond James.

General Fund Investments. Excess funds of the Grand Commandery are held in a managed investment account at Raymond James in Peoria, Illinois; however, that brokerage account is a combination of the General Fund investments, Jones Permanent Fund and Graff Memorial Fund, due to the Investment Committee combining those three funds, for investment purposes, into one brokerage account in 2013. The Grand Treasurer separately accounts for the endowment funds by allocating income, investment advisory fees and capital gains/losses, both realized and unrealized, among the three components of the investment account.

Jones Permanent Fund. This Fund was established in 2004 from the amounts left from the 2003 Triennial Expenses raised through an assessment. This is an endowment fund from which one-half of the income is available for general Grand Commandery Expenses. Contributions to this fund should be promoted to increase the fund as a permanent sustaining fund of the Grand Commandery. Graff Memorial Fund. This fund was established in about 2002 when Dottie Graff, wife of Richard L. Graff, Grand Recorder, passed away. The stipulation for this endowment fund is that the fund is to be increased by donations of memorials and accumulated income until the fund reaches \$20,000.00, after which income from the fund can be used for general Grand Commandery Expenses. The fund has reached \$20,000.00.

Eloise H. Phillips Charity Fund. This endowment fund is a separate investment account at Raymond James and was established in 1978 from a bequest to the Grand Commandery with a stipulation that the principal donated remain, in the amount of \$116,114.98, and that only income be used for charitable purposes as specified in her Will.

Fiscal Officer's Fund. This fund is also held in a separate investment account at Raymond James and was established to pay claims made by constituent Commanderies should a financial officer misappropriate funds. In essence this provides Commanderies protection against malfeasance or misfeasance by financial officers. No claims have been allowed on this fund and contributions to this fund were discontinued a few years ago. **Holy Land Pilgrimage Fund.** This fund is held in a separate investment account at Raymond James and receives donation to pay for sending ministers to the Holy Land through the Grand Encampment Holy Land Pilgrimage program. Of the fund balance, \$2,400.00 is a restricted endowment.

Life Membership Fund. The Grand Commandery is considered a trustee of this fund, which represents the life memberships purchased by the constituent Commanderies for its members. This fund is held in a separate investment account at Raymond James, Hilltop Wealth Management. Before 2012, the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons managed the investment and distribution from a combined life membership fund for Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery. That fund was divided in 2012 into its three separate components for investment and distribution by the individual Grand Bodies. The Investment Committee manages the investment of the funds and the Finance Committee determines the amount of annual distributions, based upon the income and balance as of December 31 of each year. This year's distribution considered a rolling three year ending balance in determining the distribution amount to recognize investment gains, as well as income, including past capital gains This year's distribution was \$2.70 per \$50.00 share, or a return of 5.4%. Next year's distribution will be determined after December 31, 2019.

REVIEW OF 2018 FISCAL YEAR.

The Grand Commandery hired Striegel Knobloch & Company, L.L.C., an accounting firm in Bloomington, Illinois, to review the books for the 2018 Fiscal Year and assist in filing back 990 Tax Returns and an application for reinstatement of the Grand Commandery as a tax-exempt organization. They completed the review and found the records of the Grand Treasurer accurately reflected the financial condition of the Grand Commandery. A copy of the Review was provided to the Finance Committee and may be obtained from the Grand Treasurer.

The Knights Templar Eye Foundation 51st Voluntary Campaign ran from June 1, 2018, through May 15, 2019. A Total of \$1,065,463.11 was realized from this Campaign from Contributions by Sir Knights and Commanderies.

The Sir Knights of Illinois were generous and contributed \$22,553.00 and supporting donors were generous and contributed \$21,052.87 to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, totaling \$43,605.87. This placed Illinois 8th in the Grand Encampment in Contributions. Our Per Capita Contributions were \$13.15 per Sir Knight, and placed us 26th in the Grand Encampment in that category.

The above mentioned Contributions, plus Trusts and Wills, made the Grand Total for Illinois to be \$92,999.87, and the Grand Encampment's Grand Total to be \$1,756,414.39 and which was received by the Knights Templar Eye Foundation during the 51st Voluntary Campaign.

First Place in Dollar Contributions in Illinois was Elwood #6 with \$3,900.00 and First Place in Per Capita Contributions was also Elwood #6 with \$65.00 per member. Congratulations, Sir Knights of Elwood #6!

Seven Commanderies contributed \$10.00 or more per member. These are:

REPORT OF THE PROTOCOL COMMITTEE

To emphasize the importance of Protocol, the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar prepared a Protocol slide presentation for use at Department Conferences. I won't go into the information on every page but the very first slide is entitled "Templar Protocol" Do the right things! Do things right! The second slide followed with "Protocol, the meaning. The next slide was "Why Observe Protocol?" Not just WHO gets introduced; but <u>when</u> and <u>how</u>. And this was just the beginning of the slide presentation regarding correct protocol for Knights Templar across the United States.

With this, and much more in mind, I called upon our Grand Commandery "sage", REPGC John Riedas, to give me his thoughts on Protocol. This is what he shared: "Protocol by definition is "the accepted code of behavior in a particular situation". As Knights Templar is a quasi-military organization there have been set up a set of rules which govern the organization as to the proper procedure in presenting and introducing members of the organization who have achieved certain ranks of distinction. The history of Templary has always had a deep respect for those who have achieved various levels of responsibility within the Order. Thus, protocol has been an important part of the Templar Organization from its very inception. The system which has evolved over the years has become a sign of respect for those individuals who have gone over and above in their dedication to the Order. The system is in universal usage throughout the Templar world. Were you to line up each Knight Templar who was and who is currently alive, there is only one place in that line for each Sir Knight. From the Most Eminent Grand Master to the newest Sir Knight, each has his particular place in that line. Without such a system of protocol you would have mass confusion among the ranks with who should be where and when and how they should be introduced.

Right Eminent Grand Commander Mark Keagle assigned the Protocol Committee the task of developing a more workable form of conducting introductions at Inspections. In attempting to carry out his wishes, an introduction card system and new protocol sheet were devised. Each card contained the name and title the person being introduced has attained. This procedure eliminated the Inspecting Officer going through the Protocol sheet to find all the titles of the person who was going to be introduced. All Inspecting Officers received a package containing the new introduction cards. The Aides to the Inspecting Officers were to give the appropriate cards to the Inspecting Officer so introductions could be made in a simple but quick manner.

However, as I attended inspections throughout the year, I saw very little, if any, use of the new protocol system for introductions. I don't know the reason why the cards were not used. Was it because of the lack of training or was it because of an attitude of "I'll do it my way"?

Next, we gathered all the information we could find regarding Grand Encampment protocol, the Illinois Grand Commandery protocol and, finally, local Commandery protocol. I am sorry to say that we would have liked to have a "Protocol" pamphlet produced in mass to distribute to every Sir Knight for their personal use. This would stop endless searches of various sources in order to find information regarding protocol while ensuring the same proper protocol procedure is utilized by everyone.

We pass the charge on to the members of the next Protocol Committee to obtain funds to have these pamphlets published and distributed.

The Inspection will consist of an examination of monthly and permanent records of the Recorder and Treasurer, including special funds of the Commandery. All equipment and paraphernalia and their arrangements that are used in the Order of the Temple will be inspected.

It is the responsibility of the Eminent Commander to see that the Ritual and Tactics of the Order are performed in an impressive manner. Each Commandery is required to Open and Close in Full Form as specified in the Illinois Tactics "Full Form Opening" located on the Grand Commandery website, performing the Evening Work will is encouraged. Joint inspections for this work MUST be approved by the Grand Commander. Uniform requirements, as covered in the Statutes of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America, Chapter XIX, will be followed.

Starting time for all Inspections will be 10:00 A.M. unless otherwise determined by the Inspecting Officer. The Order of the Temple will begin promptly at 1:00 P.M.

PUBLIC ASSEMBLY, VISITS AND ESCORTS

Dispensation is hereby granted to all Commanderies to appear in public, in full Templar uniform and in suitable numbers to present a proper appearance within this jurisdiction, for attendance to Divine Services, Funerals, Escort Duties to other Masonic Bodies, Scottish Rite Reunions, and Public Parades. In all cases, all Sir Knights must be dressed uniformly. In the case of a parade, each Commandery marching as a separate unit must be dressed uniformly.

DEMITS AND SUSPENSIONS

DEMITS

All requests for demits are to be reviewed by the Eminent Commander. He should appoint a Committee to make a personal contact with the Sir Knight requesting the demit. After being contacted by the Committee, The demit will then be issued providing the Sir Knight is clear on the books of the Commandery. No dues are to be collected after the date of the demit.

SUSPENSIONS

Suspensions of members of a Commandery due to being in arrears for dues and/or other indebtedness are to be made in compliance with Sections 460 and 460B of the Statutes of the Grand Commandery of the State of Illinois. At the first Stated Conclave of the Commandery in October the Recorder shall report to the Commandery the names of all of the Sir Knights subject to suspension. The Commandery has the right to remit the dues of those Sir Knights in arrears when the Sir Knight is judged unable to comply due to illness, infirmity, or financial inability. Those instances of compassion demonstrate pure Templar benevolence. The Eminent Commander will appoint a Committee to make a personal contact with the Sir Knight in question to determine how his membership can be continued. The Recorder will complete "Report to the Grand Commandery on Members subject to Suspension" sending copies to the Grand Recorder, The Grand Commander will cause a personal contact with the Sir Knight and report back to the Commandery. All proceedings are to be made a part of the minutes of the Stated Conclave in October. If no report is received back from the Headquarters of the Grand Commandery. You may proceed with the action of suspending the Sir Knight from the Commandery.

DISPENSATIONS

Dispensations may be issued upon request as authorized by the Statutes of the Grand Commandery of the State of Illinois. The Eminent Commander shall make such request, over his signature and bearing the Seal of the Commandery. All requests shall specify the date of the action and provide all pertinent information necessary for evaluation. The request must be forwarded to the Grand Commander with an appropriate time interval for his review and reply. After issuance, the original copy of the dispensation will be promptly returned to the Grand Commander with a full report of the action taken. The actions of the Commandery will be regularly recorded in the minutes of the Commandery.

FIFTY YEAR PRESENTATIONS

Every Knight Templar who has been in good standing without interruption for a period of fifty years will be recognized with a fifty year membership card and pin and shall not be required to pay any further dues to his Commandery. It is the responsibility of the Recorder of each Commandery to notify the Grand Recorder who will forward the card and pin to the Commandery for presentation on the anniversary date. The Grand Commander will be notified by the Grand Recorder and will make the presentation if circumstances and time permit; otherwise, it is suggested that the presentation be made at a suitable public or Fraternal function.

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR

The Knights Templar Cross of Honor for exceptional and meritorious service to the order was established by Section 237(b) of the Grand Encampment Statutes. This award can be awarded to only one Sir Knight in this jurisdiction and previous nominations shall be resubmitted during the current year. All nominations shall be submitted to the Grand

Commander no later than April 1, 2019.

G. WILBUR BELL EXCALIBUR AWARD

This award can be awarded to one Sir Knight in this jurisdiction and previous nominations shall be resubmitted during the current year. All nominations shall be submitted to the Grand Commander no later than *April 1, 2019*.

PAST COMMANDER CROSS & CROWN SERVICE AWARD

This award sets forth leadership criteria for immediate Past Commanders worthy of such recognition. This award was designed mainly to prompt greater overall efficiency in a Commandery's operation. While the newly elected Commander is the only one qualified to apply for and receive the award, he cannot do so alone. The requirements can only be met through the combined efforts of the entire Commandery. It is the Commander, however, who must provide the leadership and incentives which will stimulate and inspire the Commandery to success. The Commander must have served his Commandery on all three Dais Chairs to receive this award.

To qualify:

1. Hold four meetings with nine members present in uniform.

2. Two of the four meeting must be:

Annual Inspection with installed officers in uniform doing the full form opening, closing and reception of Inspecting Officer.

Christmas Libation with members in uniform attending together with family members in the Commandery's asylum.

3. Within 40 miles: create a project that will cloth the naked, feed the hungry, bind up the wounds of the afflicted, or assist widows and orphans. The project should involve Sir Knights and their families.

Within 40 miles: make personal contact with all Commandery members and invite them to attend the meetings and dinners.

5. Appoint at least one Commandery Mentor who must attend training at the first session scheduled on August 16th in each Division.

6. Submit the 2019 annual report to the Grand Recorder on time.

At the close of the term, the applicant must submit a second letter to the Inspecting Officer summarizing achievements during his term.

A Past Commander Pin and Certificate will be issued to the recipients by the Grand Commandery. The Pin may be displayed only on the Suit Jacket and not worn as part of the uniform.

HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE MINISTER PROPOSALS

The minister's applications must be submitted by <u>September 14, 2018</u> to the Office of the Grand Recorder. The committee will be selecting the minister prior to <u>November 1, 2018</u>. The goal of the Grand Commandery is to have at least one minister per year participate in this memorable program, if the Holy Land Pilgrimage Fund has enough money to send a minister.

MASONIC YOUTH ORGANIZATIONS

From our Masonic youth organizations of today will come our future leaders of tomorrow. Therefore, it is requested that each constituent Commandery lend its support by attending their meetings, both initiatory and stated and by providing them with financial support to the ability of the Commandery. Our youth groups are more than willing to support our Commanderies in their activities and should be called upon whenever it is appropriate. We should also give them our support by providing escorts or whatever service they may require.

RECEPTION OF THE GRAND OFFICER

The format is located on the Grand Commandery website and should be use at the next visit or Inspection that occurs at your next Commandery meeting.

KNIGHT TEMPLAR MAGAZINE

The Knight Templar magazine published by the Grand Encampment is mailed to each Sir Knight in the State of Illinois, provided the Recorders of the constituent Commanderies have posted their information of Knighting's, Suspensions, Affiliation's, Demits, Deaths, and Top Line Signers on the Masonic Membership Solutions (MMS) and/or forwarded their monthly reports to the Grand Recorder. These reports are the only address source for the monthly mailing by the Grand Encampment. The Knight Templar magazine is the primary news source of Templar coverage for both the United States of America and the State of Illinois. <u>Recorders, please make your monthly reports to the Masonic Membership Solutions and /or to the Grand Recorder on time so no Sir Knight in the State will miss this valuable</u>

source of information. All Commanderies are encouraged to submit pictures and information about Commandery activities and accomplishments of interest to other Sir Knights in the State. TEMPLAR MEMORIALS

Upon the death of any member of a constitute Commandery in the State of Illinois, the Recorder of the deceased Member's Commandery is requested to send to the Grand Recorders office a notification regarding the deceased member's name, including his address, next of kin's address, his date of birth and any other information pertaining to the Sir Knight. The Grand Recorder will respond with appropriate condolences to the bereaved family. <u>The Recorder must also report the death in his MMS report, and/or the Monthly Report.</u>

MEMBERSHIP

Every Knight Templar knows that the lifeblood of any organization is membership, and it remains the obligation of each and every Sir Knight in the State to promote membership at all times. The Grand Commandery encourages every Knight Templar to go back and work in and support his local lodge. The Chapters of RAM also need our assistance. You cannot expect someone to join a Commandery of Knights Templar if they know nothing about the organization or do not recognize the Temple members. Recognition that the members of the Commandery are supporting the Lodge and Chapter goes a great distance in encouraging a Blue Lodge Mason to continue his search for Masonic Light in the YORK RITE OF FREEMASONRY.

PAST COMMANDER AWARD

As an incentive and encouragement to the Dais Officers to actively complete the three dais positions and provide the expectations of leadership of their offices, the Grand Commandery has developed a Past Commander Cross and Crown Award program.

The Cross and Crown Award program will issue, through the Grand Recorder, Green Certificates of Completion for the positions of Captain General and Generalissimo after the Inspecting Officer has notified the Grand Recorder of the successful completion of the work done by the office holders.

The Grand Recorder will also issue a Gold Certificate to the Commander after the Inspecting Officer has notified the Grand Recorder of the successful completion of the work done by the Commander.

The Past Commander Awards will be issued to the Past Commander after a certification of successful completion of their assigned positions from the Constituent Commandery's Recorder, along with copies of the Green and Gold Certificates are received by the Grand Recorder and Reviewed and approved by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.

The successful recipients of the Past Commander Award will be recognized and will receive their awards at the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery.

The Past Commander Award Rules and will be posted on the Grand Commandery Web Page.

DECORUM

Sir Knights who are witnessing and are not performing ritual and tactics during the conferral of the Orders of Templary will refrain from unnecessary conversations and movement about the Asylum. It is disturbing and distracts from the solemnity and dramatic nature of the Templar experience. There are appropriate times during the conferring of the Orders that conversations and movements can be made without distracting from the work being performed.

KYCH JEWEL

The award of the KYCH JEWEL is a York Rite Honor. The only item that may be worn on the Uniform is one that has been authorized by the Grand Encampment or Grand Commandery uniform code. Therefore, the KYCH Jewel should **NEVER** be worn with your Commandery Uniform. (Decision. 1955, William C. Gordon)

APPROPRIATE TEMPLAR JEWELS

Templar Jewels are "to be worn from the left shoulder to the left lapel of the standard uniform coat beginning at the left shoulder seam, the Red Cross or Malta Jewel as preferred, honorary jewels ending the highest jewel of office, present office jewel being designated as highest office. The Malta Jewel must be worn on the uniform coat even if other jewels are not worn." Jewels are to place in a straight line even with the breast pocket and <u>WILL NOT</u> exceed the number that can be placed in a specified area of the uniform coat. HEADQUARTERS

Headquarters for the Grand Commander, the Grand Recorder, and all Committees will be the Marriott Hotel and Convention Center, Normal, Illinois. The Credentials Committee will be open on Saturday, August 3, 2019, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. for the registration of Grand Commandery Officers, Past Grand Commanders, Commanders, Generalissimos, Captain Generals, Past Commanders, and all Sir Knights of Constituent Commanderies. Any Sir Knight holding a proxy shall present it at the time of registration. All Illinois Sir Knights will be required to show their current Dues Card at the time of registration. <u>REGISTRATION WILL CLOSE AT 10:00 A.M. SHARP</u>.

ATTENDANCE AT CONCLAVE

It is the duty of the Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General of each Constituent Commandery to be present at the Grand Conclave and such <u>attendance is required by</u> <u>Section 67 of the Grand Encampment</u> Code. Sir Knight William J. Farris, Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander, is the Attendance Officer for this Grand Conclave and as such will report on attendance of all Dais Officers of Constituent Commanderies.

PROXIES

In the event the Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General of a Constituent Commandery is unable to attend the Grand Commandery Conclave in person, each may appoint as their proxy, a member in good standing of the same Constituent Commandery. Such proxy does not by virtue of the appointment become a member of this Grand Commandery. The Grand Recorder has mailed three proxy forms to each Commandery, which must be filled out, signed by the officer appointing the proxy and bear the seal of the Commandery, and thus, the proxy should be prepared before you leave home. The proxy must be filled with the Credentials Committee at the time of registration.

ROLL CALL

There will be a roll call by the Grand Recorder of the Grand Representatives from Illinois to other Grand Jurisdictions.

VOTING

All Grand Commandery members in good standing, present in person or by proxy <u>SHALL</u> <u>HAVE ONLY ONE VOTE</u>. A current member of the Grand Commandery holding a proxy for another member of the Grand Commandery shall have only one vote. For a Sir Knight to be eligible to vote, the Sir Knight shall be a member of at least one Constituent Commandery that is not in arrears in payments due to the Grand Commandery.

UNIFORMS

Full Templar Uniform, including black shoes and socks, chapeau and white gloves shall be worn at the convening of the Grand Conclave. Swords will only be required by Grand Officers and those participating as escorts. <u>Summer Uniforms are permitted for any session after lunch.</u>

BE IT RESOLVED that the Uniform Bylaws for Constituent Commanderies referenced in Section 459 of the Statutes of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois be amended by adding the word "May" just before "June" to Section 3 (a).

Section 3 currently reads: SECTION 3. (a) Stated conclaves of this Commandery shall be held on _______ of each month at _______o'clock, P.M. The Annual Conclave shall be held on the day and hour fixed for the first stated conclave in June.

If amended, Section 3 would read:

SECTION 3. (a) Stated conclaves of this Commandery shall be held on _________of each month at _______o'clock, P.M. The Annual Conclave shall be held on the day and hour fixed for the first stated conclave in (May) or (June) (*Pick one*).

BE IT RESOLVED that Section 459 of the Statutes of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois be amended by changing the period at the end of the first sentence to a comma and inserting the following language:

and which shall include the requirement that a quorum for the conducting of business shall be at least five members entitled to vote therein, including at least one dais officer, and that a quorum for conferring any of the Orders shall be nine regular Sir Knights.

Section 459 currently reads:

SECTION 459. For the government of its affairs, each chartered constituent Commandery in this Grand jurisdiction shall enact such code of uniform bylaws as may be enacted by this Grand Commandery, but not in conflict with the laws of the Grand Encampment.

Provided, the amount of fees for conferring the Orders (not less than \$45.00); the amount of annual dues for each member; the time or date of stated conclaves and the hour for opening such conclaves may be determined by such constituent Commanderies respectively. Provided, further, that bylaws, and/or amendments thereto, of constituent Commanderies shall not become operative unless or until approved by the Grand Commander, which approval shall be subject to review of the next succeeding annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery.

Each Constituent Commandery shall carry insurance property insurance on its paraphernalia, equipment, and other property as listed in the Annual Report and Inventory in such amounts as recommended by the Finance Board and general liability insurance in an amount of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) annual aggregate, insuring against negligent acts of the Commandery, its officers and members while performing work or business of the Commandery A certificate of insurance may be required to be produced at the annual inspection of the Commandery. If amended, Section 438A would read: INSURANCE

SECTION 438A. Each Constituent Commandery shall carry property insurance on its paraphernalia, equipment, and other property as listed in the Annual Report and Inventory in such amounts as recommended by the Finance Board and general liability insurance in an amount of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000, 000) annual aggregate, insuring against negligent acts of the Commandery, its officers and members while performing work or business of the Commandery. A certificate of insurance may be required to be produced at the annual inspection of the Commandery. (2019)
