

Sir Knight Auston E. "Gene" Smith is the Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois; having been elected to that office in July 2020. He works closely with the other senior officers of the Grand Commandery to execute the activities and priorities of our grand jurisdiction. Sir Knight Smith is a member of Tancred Commandery No. 2, Belleville, IL, and served as Commander from 2014 to 2015.

Sir Knight Smith's mother lodge St. Clair Lodge No. 24 in Belleville, IL, where he was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in July 2011, served as Lodge Secretary from 2012 to 2014 and then as its Worshipful Master in 2015. He is also a member of Kaskaskia Lodge No. 86 in Red Bud, IL where he served as Treasurer in 2015 and then two years as its Worshipful Master during 2016 and 2017. He has been elected as an honorary member in a number of lodges in Illinois. Sir Knight Smith served the Grand Lodge of Illinois as the District Deputy Grand Master of the 6th Southern Masonic District from 2016 to 2017. Also, he currently serves as Senior Grand Deacon of the Grand Lodge of Illinois.

Sir Knight Smith has been an active member and leader in the Appendant Masonic Bodies. In the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite Valley of Southern Illinois, he is a 32nd Degree MSA and past Sovereign Prince of the Cahokia Council of Princes of Jerusalem and a current member of the Valley's Board of Directors. Sir Knight Smith has also shared his leadership talents with the York Rite Bodies; he has the distinction of having served as the leader in each of the three bodies (Excellent High Priest - Royal Arch Masons, Thrice Illustrious Master - Cryptic Masons, and Eminent Commander - Knights Templar). In 2017, Sir Knight Smith received the Knights of the

York Cross of Honour (KYCH). Also, he is an active member of the Ainad Shrine (Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine) Legion of Honor.

Sir Knight Smith's other Appendant affiliations include The Royal Order Masonic Knights of the Scarlet Cord of the USA; Southern Illinois York Rite College #33; The Philalethes Society; Shamrock Council 43 of the Knight Masons of the USA; Pathos Tabernacle No. 58 of the Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priest; Grand College of Rites of the USA; Potomac Court No. 107 of the Royal Order of Athelstan, Province of USA; Legion of Honor of Ainad Temple of Shriners International; Cahokia Council No. 225 of the Allied Masonic Degrees of U.S.A.; St. Edward Conclave of the Red Cross of Constantine and the Royal Order of Scotland.

Sir Knight Smith enjoyed a long and distinguished career in the United States Air Force spanning almost 34 years. Beginning in the enlisted force in 1973, he quickly advanced to the rank of Staff Sergeant. In 1979, after completing his undergraduate degree, Sir Knight Smith was accepted by the Officer Training School where he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant and subsequently remained at that institution for the next two years as an Instructor. During the next three decades, Sir Knight Smith held a wide variety of roles and positions which afforded him exceptional professional growth and leadership experiences. He held command positions at the squadron, group and wing levels. He also served in several overseas assignments including Honduras, South Korea, Germany and Portugal; in particular, he served in Saudi Arabia and Kuwait during the Gulf War. Along his military journey, Sir Knight Smith won numerous awards and decorations including the Legion of Merit with 2 oak leaf clusters; Defense Meritorious Service Medal; Meritorious Service Medal with 5 oak leaf clusters; Joint Service Commendation Medal with 1 oak leaf cluster; Air Force Commendation Medal with 2 oak leaf clusters; and the Air Force Achievement Medal with 2 oak leaf clusters. In recognition of Sir Knight Smith's extensive skills, knowledge, and leadership talent, he was promoted to the rank of Colonel in February 2001. He served at that rank until retiring from active duty in December 2006.

Sir Knight Smith excelled through several academic and educational institutions including earning a Bachelor of Science degree (1978) from Troy State University in Troy, AL and a Master of Arts degree (1983) from Webster University in St. Louis, MO. He successfully completed coursework at numerous senior military colleges and universities including Marine Command and Staff College (1982); Air Command and Staff College (1988); Air War College (1996); Combined Warfare School, Armed Forces Staff College (1996); and the College of Strategic Studies and Defense Economics, George C. Marshall European Center for Security Studies (1997) in Garmisch, Germany; for this last institution, Brother Smith embraced his passion for helping others learn by remaining on staff for three years as the Dean of Academics and then Executive to the Director.

Sir Knight Smith has spent more than 49 years building a loving family with his wife including the quality time spent with his daughter and granddaughter. In his limited leisure time, he enjoys collecting rare writing instruments, Masonic research and collecting Masonic antiques. As an active and avid learner, Sir Knight Smith enjoys searching for "lost knowledge" and exploring the "wisdom of the ages" along with several other subjects related to Freemasonry in Illinois and around the world.

REGC Smith: I want to thank all for taking time to come visit our annual conclave and as in any great and important undertaking it didn't go exactly as planned but we hope you have a pleasant experience here. Commandery how about another round of applause for all the visiting guests.

REGC Smith: Eminent Commander Vernon LaGesse please escort Sir Knight Harris Edwin Boeker to the dais.

REGC Smith: Allow me to explain why we are doing this a little bit unusual. Sir Knight Boeker has the pleasure of attending his son's second and third degree tomorrow. So, he can only stay until about lunch time, so before we open the conclave, I wanted to make sure we get this done. I'll tell you why he is an important person in my life. About 2012 I was to be knighted in the Belvidere Commandery in Alton, they were holding me over for an inspection. I had been ready for 8 months, and ready I want to do this. So, the day arrives and fortunately the person who was supposed to do the Order of the Temple, for some reason I don't know, canceled, and couldn't come. My commandery mentor immediately picked up the phone and called the guy that always comes, Sir Knight Boeker. From Petersburg to Alton is quite a drive in a storm with his wife, arrives with all smiles. He gave me a ceremony that I will never forget, and I have seen a lot of ceremonies in my military career, but this was unmatched. So, in my role as Grand Commander, I had the opportunity to write articles for the Knight Templar magazine. The first one or two that I wrote, I think the day that it arrived in the post offices, Sir Knight Boeker called me and mentioned how much he enjoyed reading my article. Which I took as a great compliment. In that conversation we started talking about swords, because it was his sword that dubbed me Sir Knight. He informed me that same sword dubbed him Sir Knight, 1957 I believe. He also told me that sword belonged to a past Eminent Commander of St. Aldemir Commandery, who was a commander in 1947. So, that sword has been knighting Sir Knights in Illinois at least since 1947. In Central and Southern Illinois that is a lot of knights that were dubbed by Sir Knight Boeker. So, as you know, the Grand Encampment created and authorized a meritorious service medal in 2019. The members of St. Aldemir commandery number 47, stationed Petersburg, Illinois have unanimously approved the award of this year's Commandery Meritorious Service Medal to Sir Knight Boeker. One other comment about Sir Knight Boeker's son Dennis receiving his degrees tomorrow, that will be 69 years to the day from when Sir Knight Boeker was raised to Master Mason. Quite an accomplishment to have your son here. So, again congratulations.

Eminent Prior Wys: Due to Covid 19, we were unable to do a few things last year. Our Grand Commander earned his Quadrant to his KYCH jewel of which we are going to present to him at this time.

MEGHP Vice: Right Eminent Grand Commander may I approach the east.

REGC Smith: You may. Sir Knight LaGesse will you please escort Sir Knight Boeker to the east again.

MEGHP Vice: It was decided a few years ago that all the leaders of the York Rite Bodies would get together and select a Companion and Sir Knight to receive what is known as the York Rite Mason of the Year. We could not have selected a more acceptable Mason to receive this award. Sir Knight Boeker, Companion and friend thank you.

REGC Smith: Eminent Grand Warder post the Eminent Grand Sentinel and inform him that the 165th annual conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois is about to be convened and direct him to guard accordingly.

EGW Cowart: Right Eminent Grand Commander the Sentinel is informed, and the asylum is duly guarded.

REGC Smith: Commandery attention please join me in the Pledge of Allegiance to our flag. Hand salute. I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

REGC Smith: Sir Knights uncover.

REGC Smith: Excellent Grand Prelate please lead our devotions.

EGP Hileman: Glorious Lord God, we take a moment to pause in our deliberations to remember that You are the source of all goodness and light. We thank you; we praise you for this institution of Christian Knight hood which is so dear to our hearts. We pray that we feel your presence with us here today and that this conclave meeting be conducted in peace and harmony. EGR Keagle: Right Eminent Grand Commander I will make the report for SK Wright.

REGC Smith: Ok.

EGR Keagle: Right Eminent Grand Commander the committee reports that we do have a quorum and requests more time to complete the report.

REGC Smith: Our parliamentarian for this session is not present, so in this situation I am appointing SK Hileman as our parliamentarian. Also judges of the elections will be all present members of the jurisprudence committee.

VEDGC Sansone: Right Eminent Grand Commander I move that all Sir Knights in good standing be permitted to attend this conclave.

EGG Clark: Second.

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded that all Sir Knights in good standing be permitted to attend this conclave. All in favor extend sword arm. Down hands. All opposed the bridal arm. The Motion passes.

EGG Clark: Right Eminent Grand Commander I move the election of officers be held at 10am and the Annual Meeting of the Illinois Knight Templar Home Corporation be held during a recess immediately thereafter.

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded that the election of officers be held at 10 am and the Annual Meeting of the Knights of Templar Home Corporation be held during the recess immediately thereafter. All in favor extend sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed the bridal arm. The Motion passes.

VEDGC Sansone: Right Eminent Grand Commander I move that all committee reports published in the preliminary proceedings be accepted and approved as written, except those called for by the Grand Commander.

EGG Clark: Second.

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded that all committee reports published in the preliminary proceedings be accepted and approved by the Grand Commander. All in favor extend sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed the bridal arm. The Motion passes.

EGR Keagle: Right Eminent Grand Commander I move that the minutes of the 164th Conclave of the Grand Commandry Knights Templar of the State of Illinois be approved as printed in the Proceedings that have been distributed.

EGCG Carnall: Second.

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded that the minutes of the 164th Conclave of the Grand Commandry Knights Templar of the State of Illinois be approved as printed in the Proceedings that have been distributed. All in favor extend sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed the bridal arm. The Motion passes.

VEDGC Sansone: Right Eminent Grand Commander I move that all visiting Grand Commanders and Past Grand Commanders be given Honorary Membership of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

EGG Clark: Second.

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded that all visiting Grand Commanders and Past Grand Commanders be given Honorary Membership of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the state of Illinois. All in favor extend sword arm. Down Hands. Those Opposed the bridal arm. The Motion Passes.

REGC Smith: Will all of the visiting Right Eminent Grand Commanders, Past Grand Commanders approach the East.

REGC Smith: Sir Knight Recorder call the role of the Grand Representatives of Illinois. Who will remain standing when your name is called.

May their memories remain with us forever? Although they may not have had the opportunity to request forgiveness for their sins prior to their passing, we pray that you show them tender mercies in infinite supply. We bear witness to the fact

that they confessed their belief in Jesus as the Christ, which gave them the confident expectation of the forgiveness of sins. REGC Smith: Recover, Sir Knights be seated.

REGC Smith: I now call on Sir Knight Hutt for the finance report

SK Hutt: Morning Sir Knights, Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers, Sir Knights of Illinois. The finance committee report consists of two documents. The first is the report of the finance committee, as printed in your preliminary proceedings. The second is the proposed Grand Commandery budget for the ensuing year, which was distributed during the registration. Finance committee functions throughout the year reviewing the various transactions presented by the Grand Recorder as they are occurring. Including the deposits as they are made and in the case of distributions, disbursements, and vouchers as they are approved for payment. You will see in the preprinted report a listing of those transactions. Each of the listed vouchers indicate either a deposit or an expense and may be a single transaction or it may include multiple transactions within each voucher. On Wednesday, July 28th the finance committee met in session to review and approve the Grand Commanders budget for presentation and approval today. The total projected revenue for the year is \$67,850, and expected expenses are also \$67,850 resulting in a balanced budget. By a vote of three to zero the finance committee approved this budget as printed for your consideration, and we ask that you adopt it as the Grand Commandery budget for 2021 to 2022. Right Eminent Grand Commander I would move for the approval of the finance committee report and the proposed budget as presented.

Second

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded that we have set the financial report. All in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes. Sir Knight Hutt you will now give the investment report.

SK Hutt: Right Eminent Grand Commander, Grand Officers, Sir Knights of Illinois the investment committee report is printed in the preliminary proceedings. The investment committee met virtually via zoom on May 5th, 2021, with our Raymond James investment advisor to review the portfolio performance of the Grand Commandery's investment accounts. There are two financial statements printed in the proceedings. The first is the performance by account summary. The second is the performance by year consisting of our general account, Fiscals Officer fund, Holy Land Pilgrimage fund, Graff memorial fund, Jones permanent fund, the Phillips fund, and the Life Membership fund. These reports summarize the beginning and ending market values and annualized performance for each of the Grand Commandery funds. Investment accounts continue to perform well, showing study growth, good returns even in a volatile market. Since December 31st, 2020, to June 30th, 2021, the year-to-date Grand Commandery total portfolio value has increased from \$797,801.17 to \$893,779.62 resulting from \$12,000 in contributions, \$9,460.25 in income and \$73,518.20 change in market value. Right Eminent Grand Commander I would move for the approval of the Investment Committee report as printed in the proceedings.

Second

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded that we accept the finance report. All in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed the bridal arm. Motion passes. Thank you, Sir Knight Hutt.

REGC Smith: We have 15 minutes until the election hour, so let me pick one we can do in 15 minutes. Charters and Dispensation.

VEDGC Sansone: Right Eminent Grand Commander the committee on Charters and Dispensation reviewed the dispensation issued by the Grand Commander and found it to be in good form. The charter there was Apollo Commandery #1 and Trinity Commandery #80. Trinity #80 approved to emerge with Apollo Commandery #1. Apollo Commandery #1 voted to accept Trinity. Acceptable vote was that Apollo will now move to Naperville where Trinity currently meets. Seeing as the facility is already approved as a Templar Asylum, they found that there is no reason why that should not happen. They found all reports and records were in good order. So, we vote that this merger be allowed and we move that this report be accepted as printed.

Second

REGC Smith: I have a motion and second to approve the merger of the two Commandery's.

EGT Jegen: Grand Commander, I would move to modify that report to approve that the officers elected at the annual meeting for Trinity Commandery #80 be the resulting officers of the merged commandery.

REGC Smith: Do you accept that as a friendly amendment?

VEDGC Sansone: Yes.

REGC Smith: So, it has been amended to include the officers as explained by Sir Knight Jegen. Does everyone understand what we are voting on? Any discussion before we vote? Hearing none. All in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All opposed the bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Now go to report of Inspections.

VEDGC Sansone: Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights, this year was like no other year the Templars have seen probably since the plagues or somewhere back in that era. The Templary was shut down until May of this year and it was shut down at the end of last year leaving, I believe, five Commanderies that did not get inspected. The Grand Officers tried to come up with some fair way of doing an inspection and we could not judge you on tactics you have not done anything for 14 months, so everybody was going to be rusty. So, we decided we would look at the records of the Commanderies to make sure all proper filings were made. We would inspect any paraphernalia and go through the records to make sure all the 990s have been filed and insurance papers were in place. We had Commanderies that did not participate in the division level inspection, so they received a grade of zero. We had 9 Commanderies that got perfect score, 250. Most everyone else was in the 200's area. We are not giving any awards this year because it is unfair to pick somebody out that did a great job, everybody did the best that they could. This coming year, hopefully things have changed, and hopefully if everything goes well, and I take over and get back to our regular inspections season. So, I move that the Inspection Report be approved as submitted to the Grand Recorder.

Second

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded to accept the Inspection Report, any discussion? Hearing none. Those in favor extend sword arm. Down Hands. Those opposed the bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Grand Recorder can you give your report in 10 minutes?

EGR Keagle: I can. Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights, I submitted my report in the preliminary reports. We had a net loss for the year of 220 from June 1st, 2020, to May 31st, 2021. We had 21 knighting's and 183 pass. The data was pulled from the MMS system. It is very important for the Recorders to update that system in a timely fashion, this will ensure our numbers are accurate. I would like to thank all the Recorders for the hard work that they continue to do during this complicated time with Covid. You guys kept the work going, the Fraternity going, and allowed us to hit the ground running once we could meet in person again. So, I thank you and it was an honor to serve you as your Grand Recorder. I respectfully submit this report.

Second

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded to accept the Grand Recorder's report, any discussion? Hearing none. All those in favor extend sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed the bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Jurisprudence can you give your report in 8 minutes?

REPDC Cronk: Right Eminent Grand Commander the Jurisprudence Committee met and went over all the bylaws and dispensations that were written last year. We found that they were all well written and should be approved as they are. We also went over the proposed amendments and published that they were all in proper order and should be accepted. We found that one of the additional was withdrawn by a proposer and reinstated later, so that one we recommend by omitted. I move that this report be approved as written.

Second

REGC Smith: Thank you, Sir Knight Cronk. It has been moved and seconded to except the Jurisprudence Committee report, any discussion? All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down Hands. All those opposed the bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: We are going to get ready for the elections, before we do that, we need to do a final Credentials report. Sir Knight Wright are you ready?

SK Wright: Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights the final report of the Credentials Committee is as follows. 21 Eminent Commanders present, 8 of whom were proxies. 10 Generalissimos, 3 of those were proxies. 7 Captain Generals, 2 of those were proxies. We have 12 Grand Officers registered, 14 Right Eminent Past Grand Commanders, and 37 Eminent Past Commanders. There are 23 Commanderies represented by either an Officer or a proxy. An additional 4 represented by an Eminent Past Commander. There a 9 Commanderies with no registered representative at this conclave. A full report of these recordings will be presented to the Grand Recorder for including in the minutes. I move the acceptance of this report.

Second

REGC Smith: Thank you, Sir Knight Wright. It has been moved and seconded to accept the final Credentials Committee report, any discussion? All in favor, extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed, the bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: It has reached the hour for the elections; at this time, we will conduct the elections. I will entertain a suggestion for position of Grand Commander.

EPC: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I am (inaudible) of Mizpah Commandery and I suggests the name of John Sansone.

REGC Smith: Thank you, are there any other suggestions? Are there any other suggestions? Are there any other suggestions? Hearing none, I declare the nominations closed for the position of Grand Commander, and Sir Knight John M. Sansone be elected Grand Commander by acclimation. Sir Knight Sansone do you accept?

VEDGC Sansone: Sir I humbly accept.

REGC Smith: Thank you.

VEDGC Sansone: I move that the remaining elected officers be advanced one station, with the exception of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder who shall remain in their office.

Second

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded that the elected officers be advanced one station, with the exception of the Grand Treasurer and Grand Recorder, any discussion? Hearing none. Those in favor, extend sword arm. Down hands. Those opposed, the bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Sir Knight Clark, do you accept?

EGG Clark: I humbly accept, Sir.

REGC Smith: Sir Knight Carnall, do you accept?

EGCG Carnall: I do.

REGC Smith: Sir Knight Emery, do you accept?

EGSW Emery: I do.

REGC Smith: Sir Knight McBride, do you accept?

EGJW McBride: I do, Right Eminent Grand Commander.

REGC Smith: Sir Knight Jegen, do you accept?

EGT Jegen: Yes, Sir

REGC Smith: Sir Knight Keagle, do you accept?

EGR Keagle: I humbly accept, Right Eminent Grand Commander.

REGC Smith: Now it is time to elect a Grand Junior Warden at the bottom of the line. Are there any

suggestions for Grand Junior Warden?

SK: Eminent Grand Commander I suggested Sir Knight Don Johnson Cowart for Junior Grand Warden.

REGC Smith: Are there any other suggestions?

SK Helfer: Right Eminent Grand Commander my name is Derrik Helfer Past Commander of Beaumanoir Commandery #9. I have the privilege of suggesting the name of Chris Whitney for the office of Eminent Grand Junior Warden.

REGC Smith: Are there any other suggestions?

REPGC Schlosser: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I am Russ Schlosser Past Commander, and I would like to suggest the name of Kevin Wheeler for the office of Grand Junior Warden.

REGC Smith: Are there any other suggestions? Hearing none. We have three names, so therefore we need a ballot election. Does everyone have a ballot card? I would like for Sir Knight Cowart, Sir Knight Wheeler, and Sir Knight Whitney to approach the dais. Please line up in front of the podium and face the audience. Ok, Sir Knights you have on your right, Sir Knight Kevin Wheeler if you mark in his ballot put Kevin. You have in the center, Sir Knight Don Cowart, if you are marking his ballot write Don. On your left, you have Sir Knight Chris Whitney, if you are voting for Sir Knight Whitney, please write Chris. Sir Knights you may be seated. We will be using ballot number one. At this time the vote is open, mark your ballots. Grand Officers in the west, with the exception of Sir Knight Cowart, please collect all ballots and deliver them to the Jurisprudence table.

REGC Smith: Are all the ballots collected?

REGC Smith: If you are a member intitled to vote and need more time to mark your ballot, extend your sword arm. See none, all ballots are being counted. While they are being counted, I declare the 165th Conclave to be at recess until the tabulation is complete. During this recess we will conduct the annual meeting of the Illinois Knights Templar Home Corporation. I now call on Sir Knight Bill Jegen to conduct the Annual Meeting of the Templar Home Corporation.

EGT Jegen: Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Illinois Grand Commandery, I first wish to congratulate the Sir Knights of Illinois over the years for their extensive generosity. That extensive generosity has allowed us to accumulate investments, the income from which we can use for charitable purposes in an amount in excess of \$10,000,000. However, this is in two different corporations, one the Illinois Knight Templar Home Corporation and the other one the Illinois Knight Templar Home Endowment fund. This is the annual meeting of the Home Corporation which is a membership corporation. Each member of the Grand Commandery is a member entitled to vote on the business of the Home Corporation. The Endowment fund is different, it is not a member corporation but a self-perpetuating board of directors. The business today will include the election of a board of manager representative from the third division. Currently that position is held by Wendall Walch. I believe we will have a recommendation from the Right Eminent Grand Commander, do you wish to hold that election at this time?

REGC Smith: Yes

EGT Jegen: Would you please report your nomination suggestion?

REGC Smith: Do we have any suggestions for the representative from the third division?

VEDGC Sansone: I suggest Sir Knight Enrique Unanue.

REGC Smith: Do we have any other suggestions? Are there any other suggestions? Are there any other suggestions? Hearing none. Sir Knight Unanue is elected by acclimation. Sir Knight Unanue do you accept?

REPGC Unanue: Sure.

EGT Jegen: Congratulations.

EGT Jegen: By way of further explanation, the board of directors of both of these corporations are the six top officers of your Grand Commandery, so when you held your election for the officers you also elected the Boards of Directors. That includes four Officers, your Grand Recorder, and Grand Treasurer. What you elected now is a member of the Board of Managers, which manages the funds and makes the recommendations for the charitable contributions of the Illinois Knight Templar Home. There are five members of that Board of Managers, representing the first division is myself. Representing the second division is William Farris. Representing the third division is now Enrique Unanue. Representing the fourth division is Jesse Johns. Representing the fifth division is Charles Hileman. Those are the Managers that manage the money and make the recommendations. Now, we have one other business to conduct. As you all know, in 1950 approximately 71 years ago, the Sir Knights of the Illinois Grand Commandery saw a need to care for the aged and infirmed Knights Templar and others with the donation of a house and grounds in Paxton, Illinois. The Knight Templar Home Corporation was founded and commenced to operate a nursing home. Over the years that was expanded to a 75 bed, fully skilled nursing home facility in Paxton. Unfortunately, the business or need for nursing homes over the years changed. We found ourselves in a situation in 2015 where there was an excess number of beds, and we were incurring substantial losses to maintain that home. This group made a decision at that time to entertain offers to sell the home. In 2017, a successful sale of the home occurred. That resulted in about \$1.95 million in net cash assets. Also, in 1981, there perceived to be a need for continuing support for the nursing home and other charitable endeavors, so the Illinois Knight Templar Home Endowment fund was incorporated and given the basic obligation of supporting the home. In 1950 and 1981 the IRS did not pay too much attention to charitable organizations. However, 2007 with the revised Patriot Act, the IRS became much more interested in charitable organizations. We find our self in a position where to remain a charitable organization the IRS wants you to have 1/3 of your support or income from public donations and support. You can have investment income, but it is supposed to be less than 2/3's. We find ourselves with an embarrassment of riches so to speak in the Illinois Knight Templar Home that has investment accounts of approximately \$7.5 million to \$8 million. What we then did, after the sale of the home, was to hire professionals at the accounting firm of Eck, Schafer and Punke in Springfield, who also, I believe, offer some guidance to the Grand Lodge of Illinois, to consult and figure out how we best and meet the IRS governance issues. Their recommendation was to create the Knight Templar Home as a supported charity and the Endowment fund as a supporting charity. We looked at the incorporation documents and bylaws and determined that we were not quite in compliance. Last year we resolved the governance issues by creating the same Board of Directors for both corporations and empowering the Board of Managers to make the recommendations for the charities. The last step that we have to do, and it can be done we are told on a one-time bases, is to move the investment income out of the Knight Templar Home Corporation the unsupported charity, into the supporting charity which is now the Endowment fund. That is why I am here, to advise you that we have most of the investment funds of the Knight Templar Home in a managed account at US Bank in Springfield. A corresponding managed account has been established for the Endowment fund and about \$1.75 million in investments from the Endowment fund have been deposited into that managed account. In addition, the Endowment fund has another \$1.25 million in a managed investment account. So, I move that the approximately \$8 million in the US Bank managed account for the Illinois Knight Templar Home be moved to the managed account at US Bank in the Endowment fund so that the investment income winds up in the Endowment fund, and we can better meet the 1/3 public donation in the home corporation.

Second

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded to accept the report of the Knight Templar Home Corporation, any discussion? Hearing none. All those in favor, extend sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed, extend the bridal arm. Motion passes.

EGT Jegen: That completes my report Right Eminent. I believe it completes the business of the Annual Meeting, unless there are any questions, I would move to adjourn the Home annual meeting until next July 30th.

REGC Smith: Thank you.

REGC Smith: It has been suggested by our Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander to give you some insight on where the money goes, grants we have handed out so I will turn the microphone over to John.

VEDGC Sansone: It has always been interesting; we have talked about how much money we have but what are we doing with it? This past year was a little bit complicated because of Covid. This year we sent \$1000 checks out to each Commandery to use for charitable purpose in their community, which totaled \$32,000. We donated \$10,000 to the American Passion Play here in Bloomington, which is a not for profit where they put on the Passion play every Spring, we help continue that. We sent \$35,000, \$5,000 to each one of the dyslexia centers around the state. We donated \$75,000 to the Advocate Hospital Eye Clinic. We donated \$38,340 to purchase Life Memberships in the Knight Templar Eye Foundation for those Knights in the state of Illinois that were not Life Members. So grand total of \$190,240 was donated to charities. That was not counting what was donated through the IMOS program. Right now, we fund IMOS with monies to help our Templars within the state, so if you applied at IMOS and you are a Knight Templar, the Home Corp is picking up half the money that IMOS would grant you. We are probably looking at donating a little more this year to them to keep the fund up. That is the kind of places your money is going at this point.

REGC Smith: Thank you, Sir Knight Sansone. Any questions on what you just heard? We are doing good things with your money. I know it sounds like a lot of money, but we have money, and we have to as a nonprofit charitable organization make donations over a certain amount. If you have any questions about those numbers, see Sir Knight Sansone about the Home and Sir Knight Jegen.

REGC Smith: Do we have an election result?

REGC Smith: I Now declare the 165th Annual Conclave to be back in session.

EGP Hileman: Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights, we had a total of 86 ballots cast. Don received 36, Kevin received 33, and Chris received 17. There was no majority, and we need to vote again.

REGC Smith: You remember who you are voting for, I hope. We will use ballot number 2. Not hearing any withdraws you are still voting on three people and so we are using ballot number 2. Mark those ballots Don, Chris, or Kevin. Officers in the west collect the ballots and give them to the Jurisprudence table.

REGC Smith: If anyone entitled to vote needs more time to mark their ballot, please extend your sword arm. Seeing none. Ballots are complete.

REGC Smith: So, my dilemma is we have two committee reports remaining and my allocution, which is normally last. I think I will ask Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander to take the dais and I will go down and complete my allocution and await the election results.

VEDGC Sansone: I just wanted to take a little bit of opportunity here, if anybody has looked at the schedule, there is four things scheduled at 1:00, more people have to be in at least two of those at the same time and we didn't see any due access to make pizzas or anything like that so what we are going to

do is Sir Knight Keagle is going to hold the Recorders session and I will have the Grand Commander session together. It will take about a half hour at 1:00. At 1:30 the Past Commanders, Order of Knight Preceptors will conduct their ceremony. Hopefully, we can get back on schedule at that point with the divide service and my installation. Then we can all get to the banquet tonight. I just wanted to make that announcement. All Recorders and I would ask all dais officers to attend the short meeting we are going to have at 1:00 after lunch. We will carry on from there.

VEDGC Sansone: So now if the Right Eminent Grand Commander chooses, he can give his allocution.

REGC Smith: Well, this will be very brief because my command year was very brief due to COVID. I had some great plans. One of those plans was never to have more Zoom conferences, but we had the meeting of your Grand Commandery Officers every month by Zoom conference. We kept the business running and I'm glad we finally came out of this pandemic to the point where we could reconvene the Conclave and I think as a result of not having meetings for a year, local Conclaves, and Lodges, and Chapters are seeing an upsurge in attendance. I hope that continues. One of the things that I am concerned about, and this is a rambling allocution, is as we come out of the COVID year and bringing people in. Almost lined up at our door to get in, we have to make sure we don't lower the bar. We have to maintain quality. Remember the people who are asking to become Knights Templar did so for a reason, they may or may not wanted to become a Knights Templar so they could do more ritual. They may have wanted to become a Knight Templar so they could learn about history and enjoy wearing a uniform and having a sword. I personally don't see anything wrong with that, but if you're one of those people that just thrive on ritual, you will enjoy Knights Templar, I can assure you. I had a couple projects that I'm pushing this year and one of those is our Grand Commandery Charity, which is Eye Foundation. One of the articles I wrote in the Knight Templar magazine, I was sitting in my sunroom, I live on a lake and the lake makes appoint right outside my sunroom. I always get up and watch the news in the morning about 7-10, drink coffee, relax, enjoy being retired and I noticed exactly within 20 minutes every day around 7:30-8:00, 10 or 15 cat squirrels come around from the woods around my lake and go to the Pin Oak tree to get acorns. No fox squirrels, all cat squirrels. They go back to their nest and deposit their loot and about 10:00 fox squirrels, 8-10 fox squirrels make that same trip. They never do it together. I don't understand why nature does it that way, but these cat squirrels and fox squirrels never interfere with each other's hunt for food. As I was watching that, it occurred to me that if I could not see, I wouldn't have noticed that. Eyesight is a very valuable human sense. We don't think about that enough, I don't believe. You also have other important senses, smell, or taste whatever but if you don't have eyesight, it's a long trip. So, what I have done is try to create 100% Life Sponsorship within our Grand Commandery of the Eye Foundation. I asked ouR Grand Recorder to send out a notification to Commanderies requesting them to invite Sir Knights to join as Life Sponsors for \$30, because when I came up in my Commandery no one ever told me that was an option. No one ever said for \$30 you can become a Life Sponsor, which means you don't pay a dollar for a year nor does your Commandery. I am worried that a lot of Commanderies don't fully explain that to the new Sir Knights. So, I was lucky enough, by the way at the end of his timeline I think we still had 1291 who had not joined as Life Sponsors. That came up to about \$38,000. I asked for, pleaded, and begged and got a grant from the Endowment Fund to pay for all those Sir Knights. So, I think we can safely say at this point the Grand Commandery of Illinois is 100% life sponsors. Now the problem with that is, tomorrow we may not be because if the Commandery has and Order of the Temple, has a new Sir Knight and he says, "No, I'm not doing that" then we are no longer 100%, so how do we fix that? I hope that when we get to the proposed legislation today you will notice in the legislation that we are asking your approval to change the Knighting fee, which is currently \$10 for every Sir Knight that comes in, change that Knighting fee to \$30. Then, that Commandery Recorder sends that \$30 to the Eye Foundation and then we will maintain 100%. So, I hope you will consider that when we vote on the legislation. Another thing that bothered me when I became a member of the Grand Line, although in the interview process it was fully explained to me that this is an expensive hobby. I wanted to be a Knight Templar, so I understand the expense and that was not an issue for me, luckily. So, I stayed in the line. When I was in the line I was looking around at the members in the line, they are pretty old, most are retired, almost all have silver hair, interesting. I think the reason for that is it is very hard for a young Knight Templar to afford to be in the Grand Commandery Line. A lot of travel, and we don't reimburse anything or didn't at that time. I think that limits our pool of who we can get in the Grand Line, I don't think that's a good thing. We need to have everybody trying to get into the Grand Commandery Line. So, I issued an order that said, based on my Air Force experience, if you travel more than 200 miles one way on official business and you have 200 miles to go home, and you do an inspection which is an all-day event, you are authorized to claim per diem hotel stay. The gas is paid at the IRS nonprofit rate of \$0.37 a mile. The reason the Air Force did that is they didn't want people trying to save money driving 18-20 hours, having a wreck and killing themselves or someone else. When I issued this order that was my philosophy, that this is a safety issue. If you are traveling 20 hours, for example if you are stationed south of the state and you are inspecting in Chicago you have to spend a night, it is just too dangerous to drive that long. We should not expect a young Sir Knight to pay that out of their pocket. I hope the incoming Commander will continue that program. My allocution is published, and the proceedings spoke, and I move that my report be accepted.

Second

VEDGC Sansone: Any discussion? All in favor extend sword arm. Down hands. All opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: It has been a pleasure to be your Grand Commander and I wish John all the luck and a better year than I had because of COVID, but I know he is qualified, and he will do a great job.

VEDGC Sansone: Thank you

EGP Hileman: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I believe we have a winner of the election, and I will explain. As most of you have probably been told at some point for an election to be carried it takes 50% plus one of the registered delegates. Which I don't think we have ever done that way; we have always taken majority of the votes cast. We had 82 votes cast this time so that would mean 41 would be half and 42 would be the majority. Don Cowart had 43 so therefore it is our opinion that we do have an election.

REGC Smith: Sir Knight Don Cowart has been elected Junior Grand Warden. Sir Knight Cowart do you accept?

SK Cowart: Yes, Sir I do.

REGC Smith: Thank you.

REGC Smith: Please destroy the ballots.

REGC Smith: Are we ready for Treasurer's report?

EGT Jegen: Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights, it's been my pleasure over the last year to perform the function of your Grand Treasurer. Like all Treasurers of Commanderies, the Treasurer of the Grand Commandery is to keep just and accurate books and render his report as required. The report is in your preliminary proceedings, but I would like to highlight a few things. Before I highlight a few of the numbers, let me express my appreciation for the help this year from Dave Hutt and Max Guthrie and the

finance committee for reviewing all of the vouchers in a timely manner so we could get checks out and for reviewing and helping me keep track of investments. I would like to highlight a couple of things, a year ago the basic balance sheet of the Grand Commandery of Illinois was \$196,000 in assets. This year it is \$237,000, that results from two things, Income exceeded expenses by approximately \$15,000 and our unrealized investment income was approximately \$25,000 so the total is \$40,000 increase in asset value. In addition to that basic investment account and funds we have available the Graff Memorial fund, 100% of the income off that fund can be used if necessary for Grand Commandery expenses. We also have the Jones Permanent fund; half of that income can be used for general operations the other half is put back into the fund to increase the Endowment. On the Jones Fund, when it was established in 2003, there was a provision that donations to that fund be encouraged and there is a provision that if someone wants to become a sponsor for that fund, for the payment of \$250, they could do that. I would like to at this time pledge my \$250 and ask that others consider doing that to expand this Jones Fund, which currently sits at \$63,000. Then we can have permanent income for future support of this Grand Commandery. On the incoming expense side, I would like to explain some issues. We show postage was higher than what was budgeted and that is because we did a mailing for the Knight Templar Home and were reimbursed. You will find the reimbursement under other income. Also, under awards and plaques you will find that we exceeded the budget, but we had to find a place to put the new Meritorious Service award cost, and that cost is covered also under other income, which exceeds the budgeted amount. The bottom line is, the income this year exceeded the expenses by \$15,000, which is added to the assets. At this time, I would entertain any questions on the financial reports. I move for acceptance of the report.

Second

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded to accept the Treasurer's report. Any discussion? All those in favor extend sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Report accepted.

REGC Smith: At this time, I would ask that Sir Knight Wheeler approach the podium on the floor, Sir Knight Wheeler is our Membership Chairman and has done a great job and I hope he mentions his Leadership Program which is put together and we have it linked online. We have some awards for him to present. Hopefully, he has script.

SK Wheeler: Good morning Right Eminent Grand Commander, thank you. Sir Knights, I have a little speech before I give out the awards. Good morning, Sir Knights. My name is Sir Knight Kevin A. Wheeler Past Eminent Commander of St. Elmo Commandery 64. Although many of you may not know me, I was the one sending everyone, or the Recorders, all those emails about the membership reports and those documents. That was definitely a learning curve, but we made it work. In this past Masonic Year, I had the honor of serving as the aid de camp for Right Eminent Grand Commander Sir Knight Austin Eugene Smith. In addition to that privilege, I was given the honor of serving as your Grand Commandery Membership Committee chair. I know some of you may be thinking, membership chair, so what have they done? This is the real reason why I am in front of you this morning. This year although extremely difficult to work or get anything done, we were able to get out at least two things I am highly proud of. The first being an article written by committee member and Past Eminent Commander Johnny Loayza as a form of guidance on how to create a five-year business plan for your Commanderies, for the purposes of assisting Commanderies that are planning for the future health of your Commanderies. The second, and the reason why I am standing in front of you this morning, is the creation of the State of Illinois Knights Templar Education Program. Has anyone seen it on the Grand Commandery website? Before I continue, let me ask, why did some of you guys become Knights Templar's? Seriously, I want someone to answer that question. To learn more about the Knights Templar, right? For me personally, I wanted to know more about the history, the mystique, the secrets behind the Knights Templar for they were the best and most honorable Knights of their time. When I became a Knights Templar, although beautiful and not something I would ever trade for the world, I didn't learn much about the actual Knights Templar, what they did outside of masonry, because of that I decided to create this education program we have on our website. The program focuses on informing Knights of the actual history behind our ritual as it pertains to both masonic and actual history. The information on the program is conveniently provided by our Grand Commandery on our resources page under Education program. There are four parts. The first covering the origins of the order as we know it, followed by the section of each chivalric order. At the culmination of each section there is a short quiz with which you receive instant results, finally as a way for Sir Knights to seek further light on the old path, we have three questions regarding an essay format, if you choose to do those, those are optional. For some information, it may be refresher for those that have been around for a while, but for some of you Sir Knights it is going to be new information. Thank you for listening. I do have three awards regarding membership. I was not told what exactly they were for outside of membership. The first one Grand Encampment Membership Award and that is for Sir Knight William H. Pool Jr. Would you approach the east please. The next is the Grand Commandery Membership Award, Sir Knight Mark A. Tomany and Sir Knight Danny L. Gaddis Jr. Would you both please approach the dais.

REGC Smith: Sir Knight Cowart will you approach the floor in front of the dais. Sir Knight Cowart, as the Chairman of our Eye Foundation effort in Illinois, I believe he has some awards to hand out.

SK Cowart: Thank you very much. We have awards for the last year due to the worldwide pandemic we weren't able to pass all of them out and I do have a few. First there are some certificates I was handed. If you are here when I read these out can you come up and pick these up. These are from last year as well as a couple plaques. This is for Silangan Commandery, Bethel Commandery, St. Bernard Commandery, and Apollo Commandery. We will let Sir Knight William Jegen collect this Apollo. Also, there is a plaque for Urbana Commandery from last year, is there anyone here that can come get it? Also, a seal from Melita Commandery. Urbana Commandery is a beautiful plaque for the Eye Foundation. Very good job last year. Now moving on to this year. These are the seals; we will start with those. Bethel Commandery, St. Aldemar Commandery, Macomb Commandery, Evanston Commandery, Trinity Commandery, Tancred Commandery, Elwood Commandery, Rock Island Commandery, Aurora Commandery, St. Omer Commandery. For this year we have certificates to Beaumanoir Commandery, Urbana Commandery, Crusader Commandery, Dixon Commandery, DeMolay Commandery, Melita Commandery, Mt. Olivet Commandery, Constantine Commandery, St. Elmo Commandery, Patton Commandery, and Quincy Commandery. The Knights Templar Eye Foundation highly appreciates the contributions that you made. Also, we have a couple plaques, beautiful plaques for participation. Galesburg Commandery and Mizpah Commandery, these are for Commanderies that have more than \$10 per member. That is all the current and last year's awards. I move that the Eye Foundation report be approved.

Second

REGC Smith: It has been moved and seconded to accept the report of the Eye Foundation Committee. Any discussion? All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Sir Knights I believe that's all the committee reports that I plan to call. The other reports are published in the book of preliminary proceedings, so I encourage you to read those. Thanks to all the committee members for doing a great job this year. We are now at the point where we will go into proposed legislation. If you have been looking at the book of proceedings, you probably rolled your eyes

and think we will be here all day. I will move through this quickly. If you read the proposed legislation, you have noticed several proposed changes that dealt with commas, grammar, and spacing, didn't change anything other than that. I hope that we can agree that we do want proper formatting in our bylaws, so when we get to those, we should be able to get to those very fast. That leaves us with one that we need to vote on at this time. I will read the be it resolved section, if you follow along in your book of proceedings you will know what I'm talking about. We are talking about section 405B of the statues of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the state of Illinois. The proposal is to amend that statue by changing the amount of the knighting fee from \$10 to \$30 and adding the following language. Which shall be used by the Grand Commandery to purchase a life sponsorship in the Knights Templar Eye Foundation Incorporated for him, that being the new Knight. Is there any discussion on that proposed amendment? You can see and I will read if it's approved.

REGC Smith: Is there any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. I will go to the vote. All those in favor in amending section 405B vote by sending the sword arm. Down hands. Opposed vital arm. Motion passes. Thank you very much.

REGC Smith: The next be it resolved is section 411 of the Statues of Grand Commandery, we recommend that section be amended by changing the word Committee to read Committees on the second sentence of the paragraph. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: The next change is proposed to change section 411, subparagraph 1, to change the last word from Follows to follows, the difference is the capitalization of the word follows and also in the last sentence of that section we change the capitalization of the word Five to lower case five to get grammatically correct. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: The next section is 414 (A), we propose to amend that section to delete the semicolon following the word recorder and adding a comma in its place, deleting the word "to" proceeding the comma following the word giving and by correcting the spelling of therefor. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved that section 415 (P) is amended to change the word Amount to amount, the difference being the capitalization in the word amount. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved section 438 (A), be amended to eliminate unnecessary spaces in the currency numbers on lines four and five. Also, delete the requirement to have insurance on Hired and Non-Owned automobiles. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved section 453 second paragraph, be amended to capitalize the word Grand preceding the word Recorder. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved section 415 (P), is amended to change the word Amount to read amount in the first sentence, and the word charted to read chartered, correction of misspelling. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved that section 417 (D) be amended to add Standing Committees following the word Perennial in the first sentence. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved section 459 in the statues of the Grand Commandery of the Knights Templar of the state of Illinois be amended by inserting immediately after the first provided the following, the quorum to conduct business shall not be less than five Sir Knights entitled to vote therein, by removing the parenthetical in its entirety. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved to amend section 477 to correct the quotation mark in the second sentence immediately following the word Vinces and before the word around and eliminate the comma following the word Vinces. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved to amend section 477 Mantel (21), to delete duplicate verbiage without changing any contend. What happens is we are cutting and pasting, and we have the same sections twice, so we are just eliminating one of those. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved that the Asylum Tactics of the Grand Commandery of Illinois be amended as follows, Opening: Rehearsal instructions on page 19 should read as follows, and then we have the grip and Immaculate word to read as follows, it should be in your book of proceedings. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: I think I'm through with proposed legislation, anyone disagree? And I remind you that it's only 11:09.

REGC Smith: Be it resolved that 415 (L) is to be amended by inserting the word the word "in" between the word "keep" and the word "the" in the first sentence. Any discussion on that proposed amendment? Hearing none. All those in favor extend the sword arm. Down hands. All those opposed extend bridal arm. Motion passes.

REGC Smith: Any others that I missed?

(inaudible)

REGC Smith: I was under the impression that was withdrawn by the proposer.

SK McDorman: That is not the case Sir.

REGC Smith: Ok.

SK McDorman: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I am Michael McDorman Past Commander of Galesburg Commandery No.8, and I would also like to amend my proposal to the following. As it would read as amended, SECTION 449. Jurisdiction of all Commanderies in the State of Illinois shall be concurrent. By concurrent jurisdiction is meant that the territorial jurisdiction exercised by one Commandery is the common property of all Commanderies in the State. Any Commandery may receive the petition of any duly qualified petitioner who is a Capitular and Cryptic Mason residing in the State of Illinois and act thereon.

REGC Smith: Ok. Everyone understands the proposal. Do I have a second?

Second

REGC Smith: Motion and a second. Any discussion?

EGT Jegen: Yes, this was discussed at the jurisprudence committee. My understanding was that the wording was found to be inappropriate and not to be presented.

REGC Smith: Ok, if I understand you correctly, you are proposing a change to what you submitted in the amendment, am I correct?

SK McDorman: Yes, Grand Commander. Initially it specified only a qualified Cryptic Mason. I amended it to petitioner who is a Capitular and Cryptic Mason.

(Unable to hear)

EGT Jegen: Was that presented to the Jurisprudence Committee?

REPGC Unanue: If I may, this is an amendment to something that has been published, I think it should be deferred until next year.

REGC Smith: I have a motion and a second to vote and I have a recommendation from the Jurisprudence to wait until next year. So, how do we handle this?

(Inaudible)

REGC Smith: What is your thought Sir Knight McDorman?

SK McDorman: Grand Commander I would like to propose a vote on the proposed amendment as amended.

REGC Smith: Would you please read your amendment again, slowly? You can come up to the podium here if you want.

SK McDorman: Sir Knights the amendment as it would read, if amended. "SECTION 449. Jurisdiction of all Commanderies in the State of Illinois shall be concurrent. By concurrent jurisdiction is meant that the territorial jurisdiction exercised by one Commandery is the common property of all Commanderies in the State. Any Commandery may receive the petition of any duly qualified petitioner who is a Capitular and Cryptic Mason residing in the State of Illinois and act thereon." This would require all future Knight Templar petitioners to be both a member of a Chapter and Council. It would not require anyone who is existing as a Knight Templar that is only a Chapter Mason. It cannot require them to go back and become Council member if they do not desire.

REGC Smith: Please stay there while we have a motion and a second on the floor. Any discussion? Can you approach the mic? If it doesn't work, you will have to approach the podium and speak in the mic.

SK: Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights, I just want to make sure that the proposal is; you should have your Chapter degrees and you should have your Council degrees and then you should petition to be a Knights Templar.

SK McDorman: That is the intent.

SK: Then I urge everyone to vote for it, thank you.

REGC Smith: We have had one for, do we have any against?

REPGC Schlosser: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I would like to approach the podium.

REGC Smith: You may.

REPGC Schlosser: Sir Knights, I'm a little confused. Yesterday the Council postponed voting on removing the Chapter as a prerequisite to their membership. Today they are asking us, the Grand Commandery, to make them a prerequisite to us. If I remember, and if you forgot stand up and look around, we are the same people. What are we doing to ourselves? We are trying to put ourselves in such a hole that we can't dig ourselves out of. We can't continue to make a progression, even the Grand Lodge has recognized this is a journey not a destination. Masonic light needs to come to all of us, not in a progressive order, but in an open ideal of traversing education and understanding to enlightenment. Don't put a hole in our organization that we can't dig out of, by putting prerequisites in place where they are not now. Thank you, Grand Commander.

SK Adamson: Sir Knights I am Steven Adamson Joliet Commandery #4 Past Commander, I just wanted to throw a clarification. I understood it to be for the Chapter and Council of Illinois. I know for out of state people, may be coming or going whatever their journey may be, but I would like to recommend or suggest that they are just in good standing with their State however that would be.

SK McDorman: I believe it said a petitioner who is a Capitular and Cryptic Mason, it didn't necessarily say the State of Illinois. As long as they are recognized by Illinois.

SK Ward: Most Illustrious and Sir Knights, my name is Tim Ward, and I am Past Commander of Sycamore Commandery 15. I will say I agree whole heartedly with what Russ has pointed out. We should not put restrictions, however the Grand Commandery has already put said restrictions in place. As it reads, petition of any duly qualified Royal Arch Mason. So, if we want to get rid of restrictions we need to start there. I would say in some verbiage a Mason in good standing as opposed to putting any specific bodies in there.

REGC Smith: Any other discussion?

EGT Jegen: Yes, Right Eminent Grand Commander, William Jegen. Past Commander of Apollo Commandery 1. The requirement of Royal Arch Mason is the Grand Encampment requirement, we cannot change or eliminate that. I believe our Department Commander will agree with that. The request here is basically to add an additional prerequisite to becoming a Knight Templar. I don't believe that is prudent and would recommend this body reject that additional prerequisite and vote no on this proposition. Thank you.

REGC Smith: Approach the mic please.

SK Eberle: Stewart Eberle Past Commander of Emanuel Commandery 86 affiliated now with Belvidere Commandery #2. I rise in support of a point of order and precedent that many of our Grand Commanderies across the nation require membership in both organizations as a prerequisite. There is precedence that this is proper.

SK Helfer: Right Eminent Grand Commander Derek Helfer Past Commander of Beaumanoir Commandery #9. I don't have a for or against, I just wanted to ask, since we do have members from out of state jurisdictions that are currently present, if we could hear from them whether they require it or not in their state, just for informational purposes for this body. Thank you.

REGC Smith: Ok, before we do that, I will invite our Department Commander to make his comments.

REDC Pugh: Good morning, Sir Knights. There are some Grand Commanderies that require this prerequisite for Council. Let me ask you something, where does it stop? The Grand Encampment says you have to be a Master Mason and you have to be a Royal Arch Mason. Where does it stop because where is it that it says that? Specifically, it tells you that your obligation when you are kneeling at the alter becoming a Knights Templar. Where I agree with Sir Knight Russ, where does it stop? I believe you should belong to both, first of all, I really do. I don't understand why this would even be an issue, why would you not want to be a Council member if you are a Mason? I don't think you should put restrictions on it. West Virginia for example, does not have Council and I believe Virginia does not have Council. Both of those degrees are covered in the Chapter. I have a good friend who is a Past High Grand Priest at Virginia, and he got two quadrants, he got the purple and the red. It's up to you, but I just wanted to clarify the only thing the Grand Encampment requires is Royal Arch, it is in the obligation as Royal Arch. I will warn you, unless it goes to the Ritual Committee, if you do pass this it doesn't go in the obligation and Cryptic Masons also. That obligation still stays the same for the Royal Arch Masons. I think that this went way back. You would have to look at the history of this when the Royal Select was also covered in Chapter, and that is why it was they had just Royal Arch Masons in there. Times have changed a little bit. I just wanted to clarify that there are some, not many but some. So, thank you Right **Eminent Grand Commander.**

REGC Smith: I think I will end discussion at this point. It is my understanding from the parliamentarian that we have to vote on the proposer's amendment to his original proposal.

(Unable to hear)

REGC Smith: So, as I understand it, we are voting to approve his amendment to his original motion. Everybody understand what you are voting on. Any more discussion before we vote? You have a proposed amendment, he changed that this morning. What we are voting on now is his change to his original motion, which was submitted in writing. So, all we are doing is approving his change. If we do that, and it is approved, then we vote on the original motion. Hearing no further discussion. We will go to the vote. On the amendment to the proposal, all those in favor extend sword arm. All those opposed extend bridal arm. It appears to me that the motion passes to accept his amendment to his original motion. So, now we vote on the original motion as amended. Sir Knight McDorman will you please read your proposal as amended.

SK McDorman: The amended version, Right Eminent Grand Commander would read, and permission to start after the Commandery as the first sentence remains unchanged. The second sentence would read, any Commandery may receive the petition of any duly qualified petitioner who is a Capitular and Cryptic Mason residing in the State of Illinois and act thereon.

REGC Smith: Is there any need for further discussion before we vote?

(Inaudible)

REGC Smith: Jurisprudence has recommended a paper ballot, so have your ballots ready. We are using ballot number 3. Vote yes or no. Sir Knights in the West will collect the ballots and take them to the Jurisprudence table.

REPGC Schlosser: Right Eminent Grand Commander with your permission, may I make an announcement about the upcoming Order of the Preceptory?

REGC Smith: You may.

REPGC Schlosser: Sir Knights the Order of the Preceptory will be taking place at 1:00pm in the Redford Room A, which is right over here in the corner down the hallway and turn right. The Order of the Preceptory is available to any Past Commanders or any Commander that has been installed or any Generalissimo who will be elected and installed prior to next year's session. So, those of you who aren't familiar the Order of the Preceptory is a national organization that replaced our old Past Commanders degree. For those of you who are desirous of becoming part of the Preceptory, if you would please show up around a quarter until one so our Recorder could record you and we will make sure we are done so you are able to attend the religious service.

REGC Smith: What Sir Knight Schlosser meant to say was 1:30 according to John.

REPGC Schlosser: Exactly my words completely, thank you for that correction Right Eminent Commander, hence the reason why he is Right.

REGC Smith: Looks like we are still counting votes. We will give them a few more minutes. I reminded Sir Knights in this room that as soon as we get a vote and get through the other vote, if necessary, we have two speakers left. Before those speakers start there will be no further business from this floor, so if you have something to bring up and discuss it has to be done as soon as we finish voting. Otherwise, not at this Conclave.

EGR Keagle: Right Eminent Grand Commander

REGC Smith: Yes

EGR Keagle: May I make an announcement?

REGC Smith: Yes

EGR Keagle: I would like all the Past Grands who haven't received a packet from me to stop by the desk here at the end of the session and a representative, or preferably the Recorder from every Commandery to come up and get a packet from me when we end the session today. Thank you.

VEDGC Sansone: Sir Knights while we don't have business being conducted and the votes are being counted, I wanted to try to give you a little bit of insight on what my plans are for this upcoming year, mainly in inspections and schools area. We need to advance the age of our population to do the full inspection and evening work is beginning to be too much for a lot of the Sir Knights who participate. So, what I'm planning on is schools of instruction, we will actually do a division level open inspection for our evening work. Participation in the schools by members of the Commandery will count heavily towards your grade in the inspection. You are going to get 5 points for members attending school, and if you get 3 members there or more, you get an extra bonus on your points. So, it's carrying a lot of weight. The other thing I am planning on doing this year is we will be grading performance. What I also want the Commanderies to start to be able to do is as much as they can by themselves. We give a performance grade 1-5, that performance will remain with the Commandery no matter who does the work. If you are a member of the Commandery and you do the work, but you are not the installed officer, you will get 3 points for participation. If you are the installed officer, you will get 5 points. If you are a member form a visiting Commandery, that Commandery will get 5 points for participation. So, traveling to help out your other Commanderies is highly encouraged. We all can't do it alone; we all need each other. The other thing I am introducing is that if you have a women's program at your inspection you get another 100 points. To have women there and to have a gathering of the women is very important, we should be bringing our families in, so that could be very important in your grade. You will be graded on your opening, you will be graded on your Order of the Temple, and you will be graded on the closing at your

inspections. The divisions will remain the same as they are this year. The Inspecting Officers will be in the same position, the rest will be the Aide of the Inspecting Officer. I think we have a vote, so they are going to kick me off. I will have just enough next year.

REGC Smith: I did not hear you. Did the motion pass or fail?

REPGC Hileman: Fail.

SK McDorman: Right Eminent Grand Commander, I thank you and the members for the consideration of this motion, and I look forward to continuing our journey regardless, thank you.

REGC Smith: You have the option to resubmit next year.

SK McDorman: I don't know if that will be necessary.

REGC Smith: Last chance to have any input into this Annual Conclave before our guest speakers. Any comments? Hearing none. Our Department Commander, if he is ready, is welcome to make any comments.

REDC Pugh: Thank you, Right Eminent Grand Commander, good morning again Sir Knights. I congratulate Illinois on becoming 100% in the Eye Foundation sponsorship. If you ever have an opportunity to go to an East Central, or any, department conference please go and listen to the Eye Foundation presentation, it is amazing. I do bring you the greetings of the Most Eminent Grand Master Jeffery N. Nelson, who we have a Triennial coming up in a couple weeks that hopefully some of you are going to be going to in Minneapolis. Hopefully the covid will stay away the next couple of weeks. This was an extraordinary time to be a Mason. I really feel for Past Grand Commander Bill Farris. He didn't have the opportunity to do all the things a Grand Commander gets to do. We had a Grand Commander in Ohio, we shut down in March, there were several Grand Commanders that did not have that opportunity to go through and get to do those plans that they had longed to do. I know the Grand Commander from Indiana decided that he would like to serve another term, so he is going to get to do some of the things he really wanted to do. One of the things I was so sad was that they did not get to march up Shooters Hill at the Easter Sunrise Service. If you have never been to the Easter Sunrise Service, you should go one time in your Templar career. That is a very nice morning for you to experience, to be able to sit out there at the George Washington Memorial and, most of the time, it's a very nice Spring Day. I have also been there when there has been snow coming down. I do congratulate Sir Knight Gene on a good year, he's had a very good year. Me and him were talking back and forth many times, you guys are off to a good start. I see so far you had 21 knighting's at the end of the year. I know there are some throughout this department, my home Commander this last week did 10 or 12 knighting's. We did the Council degrees, and we did Red Cross and the Order of the Temple. It was a long day, but it was well worth it. The Masons that are coming in right now, they are on fire, they are wanting free masonry. We have to capitalize on this at this time. We can't hold back; we have to move forward. I also think that we need to listen to what some of our younger members are telling us. There were things that we did, that we tried during the close of all of this. Do I think we should do it all the time? No. Do I think it's viable, I'm talking about the zoom meetings that type of thing, we should explore that. I know that we saw members from all over that, one in particular was from Nevada. He hasn't been to a Commandery meeting in years and now that we are going back to the traditional, he can't come back. I think that we can combine these somehow, some way to make it work for everybody. I do not want to get back to the point where I'm just going to stay here on a good February night and I'm not going to go support my Commandery, I don't think that's right, we shouldn't be doing that. I'm

talking about out of state members. Right Eminent Grand Commander we have had so far, a great session.

Grand Commander what we are getting ready to present is something that was your selection and your selection alone. A Commandery had to vote and submit his name to you for the honor for the Knight Templar Cross of Honor. It is your selection, you don't have a committee, you look at all the applications and you make that selection. I'm going to let you read this please and let you do this.

REGC Smith: Certificate of award to whom these presents come greetings, this is to certify that Sir Knight Billy M. Burden member of DeMolay Commandery 24 Knights Templar of the Grand Commandery of Illinois has been awarded the Knights Templar Cross of Honor. In recognition of his exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order of Knights Templar. Far beyond the call of duty and beyond the service expected Sir Knight Burden, will you approach the East.

REDC Pugh: Sir Knight Burden it is indeed an honor to be able to present this certificate to you. Congratulations. This is the highest honor in Templary that you can receive. This is a big one, so congratulations, I'm really excited for you.

SK Burden: Sir Knights this is an absolute surprise. When I see awards given, I think that guy really did something special to earn that and I have no idea what I did. I love masonry, the York Rite, the College, what an honor, what an absolute honor. I thank you all very much.

REGC Smith: Anyone that wants to take a picture, you can.

REDC Pugh: I'm pretty confident, Grand Commander, that we can't mess up now it's very well over. It is indeed a pleasure to be able to present this to you. The Grand Commandery of the Knights Templar Commander Certificate. This is to certify that Sir Knight Austin Eugene Smith, has elected, installed and completed his term of office as the Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois for the Templar year 2021. He is entitled to the rank, distinction, and privileges of a Past Grand Commander. In witness thereof we have inscribed our signatures and caused the seal of the Grand Encampment on this 24th day of June AD 2021 AO 903 and it was signed by Jeffery N. Nelson, our Grand Master. So, Congratulations Grand Commander, it's a pleasure to present that to you. Sir Knights I do want to thank everyone, this is my last visitation to Illinois in this capacity. I would ask that you think about 2024, put a drill team back together, come to Salt Lake. I am going to be the Drill chairman of the competitive drill and drill regulations for the Grand Encampment for Mike Johnson. Think about putting a drill team together. One of the things I'm thinking about doing when I'm the Drill Chairman, I'm thinking about having an open class and it's going to consist of about 12-15 Knights. If you read some of the earlier proceedings of the Grand Encampment, it will tell you when you showed up to the Grand Encampment for drill competition you never knew what it was. You showed up and they handed you the sheet and said here is what the drill competition is, and the Sir Knights went out and they performed. Isn't that going to be a lot of fun watching, I think it will be. Thank you for all the hospitality you have shown to me and the office which I hold and congratulations and continued success.

REGC Smith: Thank you. At this time, I will ask the Grand Master of Grand Masons of the state of Illinois if he would like to make comments.

MWGM Oakley: Please be seated. Right Eminent Grand Commander Smith, Sir Knights. If you were here yesterday you heard how I opened my speech, it was how good and pleasurable it is for brethren to get

together in unity, and brethren it truly is. I think we are facing a little bit of a challenge coming up here in the next few weeks. I just received notice that the Governor has issued CDC warnings in the aeras that have a high concentration of exposure. We are probably going to work our way back into some sort of mandate on masks or something to see if that works. As always, the Grand Lodge will go along with what the Governor orders. I need everyone to understand that we are all grown men and make our own decisions but, that's the way that is. Eminent Grand Commander I appreciate, and I thank you for all the hospitality that I have been shown while I was here, along with my officers. I want to thank all of them for being here today. It is my wish and the wish of all your Grand Lodge Officers that we continue a strong relationship with all of our York Rite brethren. As we strive to free ourselves from the grasp of the Covid pandemic, I see more excitement and enthusiasm in our lodges in the hope that we are able to keep that going and sustain that for the coming times. We are planning on having a full, wide open Grand Lodge session in October, everybody knows when that is, it is the first Friday after the first Tuesday. We know there is only one Friday after the first Tuesday. It is going to be October 8th and 9th. I hope to see all of you there. We are hoping this is going to be a good turnout and we are going to try to make it a celebration. I really think we need to get back together and see our old friends and see if we can make some new ones. Thank you very much.

REGC Smith: Eminent Grand Captain General. I am about to adjourn this 165th annual conclave. See that the Grand Sentinel be informed and that he guards accordingly.

EGCG Carnall: Eminent Grand Warder. Inform the Eminent Grand Sentinel that the Right Eminent Grand Commander is about to adjourn this Grand conclave and direct him to guard accordingly.

EGCG Carnall: Right Eminent Grand Commander, your order has been obeyed.

REGC Smith: Commandery attention. Uncover. The Grand Prelate pronounce the benediction.

EGP Hileman: (Inaudible)

REGC Smith: Recover. By the virtue of the power invested in me as the Grand Commander I declare this 165th Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the state of Illinois adjourned.

Eminent Grand Warder inform the Eminent Grand Sentinel that the 165th Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery of the Knights Templar of the state of Illinois is now adjourned.

REGC Smith: You can destroy the ballots, yes.

REGC Smith: The next meeting of this Conclave will be July the 30th of 2022. You are dismissed.

ALLOCUTION

During my 5 years in the Grand Commandery advancing line, I had developed several ideas which I planned to implement when I became Grand Commander, none of those involved holding more ZOOM teleconferences! I would never wish upon anyone the command situation in which I found myself this past year, given the restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 public health crisis.

I do take some satisfaction from the many positive comments I received about the articles I wrote for the Knight Templar Magazine Illinois insert. I am glad that at least many of you read the articles, I tried to make them worth your time. I guess I am the last generation of Grand Commanders to get to write these articles since the Insert has been discontinued from the magazine.

As the Deputy Grand Commander I was involved in our reorganization of our Illinois Knight Templar Home Corporation and our Endowment Fund into a single Corporation which is now in compliance with applicable Internal Revenue Service rules for a 501(c)3 nonprofit charity. This past year as the Commander this reorganization allowed us to better meet the needs of our members and provide charitable grants to worthwhile projects.

We partnered with the Grand Lodge of Illinois and the Illinois Masonic Outreach Services (IMOS) to develop funding for our Knight Templars who found themselves in need of financial assistance. Through this partnership we have provided over \$125,000 over the past two years, including over \$50,000 this year alone in assistance to members of our Grand Commandery. I have recommended to our incoming REGC that we continue this worthwhile program by making another \$50,000 restricted

donation to IMOS at this year's Annual Communication of our Grand Lodge of Illinois.

As many of you know, I spent almost 34 years of my life in the United States Air Force. Image in uniform is important to me! One of the most frustrating things I found common throughout most of my travels to Constituent Commanderies over the past 6 years was the lack of standardization in Templar uniforms. For the most part, it is not that Knights don't care about their uniform appearance, it is that they don't know the requirements for their specific rank and no one tells them how to correct their mistakes.

Allow me to tell you a short story that illustrates my point. When I retired and moved to the small village of Smithton, I was elected as the Commander of the local American Legion Post. As such I received numerous invitations to be the guest speaker at Memorial Day and Veteran's Day events in the surrounding communities. At one Memorial Day event I was asked to speak at a ceremony in a small cemetery in which many veterans were buried. At the beginning of the ceremony, a detail of 7 Knights of Columbus in full dress uniforms were bringing the folded United States flag to the flag pole to be raised. These Knights of Columbus were truly a sight to see, marching in perfect step through the crowd, uniforms in perfect condition, red mantels and Chapeaus moving in the slight breeze! However, what attracted my attention was the group of a dozen or more youngsters, all who looked to be under the age of 10, walking beside the Knights, staring in wonder at their uniforms and marching precision! I bet each of those children thought at that moment in time, I want to be one of those guys when I grow up!

When is the last time you saw a group of youngsters marching with a group of Knights Templar in public? One reason is we Knights Templar do not appear in public very often. Why not? I recommend we seriously

consider increasing our public appearances in uniform at local parades and other events.

Back to uniform appearance, I found that most Knights Templar, especially the new Knights, have no idea where to find our uniform specifications and requirements. When I became a Templar, I asked a member of my local Commandery where to find the uniform regulations. His reply was "we don't have one" so just get a black suit and put a second row of buttons on the coat and that should work for now. I was shocked! Of course, we do have a uniform regulation; however, it is buried within the Bylaws of the Grand Commandery and most people cannot find it nor can they break the code on what is required for their specific uniform.

To solve this problem, I developed a Uniform Manual which includes pictures of the correct uniform for each position within a Commandery. I recommend this Uniform Manual be linked on our Grand Commandery webpage so all can have easy access and it can be updated with no expense.

As you have heard far too often, our membership in Knights Templar is declining, and in the foreseeable future we will cease to exist as an organization because we are literally dying off! Gone are the days when thousands of uniformed Knights Templar marched in local parades lead by Knight Templar bands and in some cases mounted Templar cavalry units on well-groomed horses. Why are younger Masons not joining our ranks?

One reason is we are not making membership in Knights Templar attractive and meaningful to younger members! One of the traits of younger generations is that they want what they want, and they want it now! If they don't find what they are looking for in our organization within a couple of meetings, they will move on. Gone are the days when a young

man wants to become a Knight Templar simply because his father or grandfather was a Knight Templar.

In my personal case, I became a Freemason because I wanted to become a Knight Templar and I found out the only way to be a Knight Templar was to first become a Mason. I was always fascinated by the history of the original Knights Templar. Once I became a Knight Templar I was disappointed that we never talk about history; both of the Masonic Knights Templar and of the original Knights Templar. Many of our Commanderies simply meet, do some ritual (maybe) and go home. This is certain recipe for how to lose membership!

When I appointed our current Membership Chairman, SK Kevin Wheeler, we spoke about the importance of Templar history. I am pleased that Kevin has developed an on-line self-paced training program on the history of Knights Templar. I recommend we continue to stress history. Not everyone who joins a Commandery does so to become an expert on Templar ritual!

The Knight Templar Eye Foundation is our charity and we should all support their efforts. When I became a member of Tancred Commandery no one explained to me that I had an option to become a Life Sponsor of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation for only \$30. No one explained that if I did not buy the Life Sponsorship, then I must pay \$1 per year, or my Commandery had to pay the \$1 for me, as my donation to the Eye Foundation. In fact, it was not until I made a \$1000 donation to the Grand Master's Club did I find out that this donation did not satisfy the requirement to pay \$1 per year as a Knight Templar to support the Eye Foundation. I am certain I am not the only one in the Grand Commandery of Illinois that was unaware of the \$30 Life Sponsor program.

It has been my primary focus during my year of command to have the Grand Commandery of Illinois achieve 100 percent of our membership become Life Sponsors. I first asked our Grand Recorder to advertise to each constituent Commandery that this was a goal and ask that each Commandery solicit Life Sponsorship from each member. Of course, I can't mandate that a member pay the \$30, so at the end of the advertising campaign we had approximately 1291 Sir Knights who are not Life Sponsors. I have requested a grant from the Illinois Knight Templar Home Endowment Fund in the amount of \$38,730 to pay for those members who are not Life Sponsors. This grant, if approved, will allow the Grand Commandery to have 100 percent Life Sponsors of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation.

The problem then becomes how to maintain this 100 percent status as new members join and elect not to pay the \$30 Life Sponsor fee. I am proposing a change to our Grand Commandery Bylaws at this 165th Annual Conclave to raise our "Knighting Fee" charged by constituent Commanderies from \$10 to \$30 and then this \$30 is then used to fund the new member's Life Sponsorship. Of course, the Commandery Recorder should report the new member as a Life Sponsor so they receive the certificate for file.

I recommend all future Grand Commanders focus on maintaining the 100 percent Life Sponsor membership. The work of the Knight Templar Eye Foundation is critically important in preserving the most valuable of all human senses, that of sight! The cost to each new Knight Templar is less than a single meal in most restaurants!

At the time this Allocution was written, our Chairman of the Illinois Knight Templar Eye Foundation, SK Dr. Don Cowart informs me that Illinois has placed First among all Grand Encampment State and Subordinate Commanderies in the "Total Contributions plus Trusts plus Wills" category

according to the reports submitted by the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc.

This is fantastic news! Thank you for continuing to help support our charity, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation.

In the business world there is a saying that "you have to spend money to make money!" The same principle is true in the Grand Commandery officer line. Over the 6-year period an officer is in the Advancing Line, travel costs can run into the thousands of dollars. This limits the pool of candidates who can volunteer for the Grand Line. This year I issued Special Order Number 1 authorizing official travel expense reimbursement in certain cases. For example, if an Inspecting Officer is performing an inspection in Chicago and he lives in the far south of the State, his travel time can exceed 6 hours; and if he returns home after an all-day inspection, travel will be into the late evening hours. This is a safety issue! My order will allow him to claim per diem, including meals and hotel expenses and mileage at the IRS rate for nonprofits, if his travel exceed 200 miles one way. This will allow a much larger pool of candidates to apply for the Grand Commandery Line. I recommend this authorization be extended by the incoming Grand Commander.

In conclusion, I see the future of Knights Templar to be promising if we simply understand that gaining membership includes recruiting younger members. We can no longer expect candidates to line up at our door asking to join. We have to sell our product!

It has been my honor to serve our Grand Commandery during the past year and I wish the incoming officers the best.

GENERAL ORDER NO. 2 (A.E. Smith) UNIFORMS, AWARDS AND JEWELS 1 November 2020

To the Officers and Members of the Grand and Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. GREETINGS:

UNIFORMS

It is the responsibility of each Eminent Commander of each Constituent Commandery to read and understand Section 62 of the Grand Encampment Statutes, quoted as follows:

- (a) The Order of Knights Templar is declared to be a "Uniformed Order.
- (b) The purchase of a uniform by a candidate shall be optional, unless the Grand Commandery holding Jurisdiction shall, under the provisions of Section 41(i), require each member of its Constituent Commanderies to be provided with a Templar uniform.
- (c) Each officer of any Constituent or Subordinate Commandery shall be required to possess a dress uniform prior to his installation, and retain possession during his incumbency in office." (1976, p. 182-184 & 336-337)
- (d) Each Constituent or Subordinate Commandery shall maintain a unit or units, equipped with full Templar uniforms as prescribed in Chapter XIX of the Statutes of the Grand Encampment, or that prescribed by the several Grand Commanderies, to be worn at full form openings and the conferring of the Order of the Temple. Such unit or units shall at all times be composed of at least six active members who shall be available for Asylum escort, triangle guard duty, Commandery drill team and such additional requirements as the Commandery may from time to time determine. (1967, p. 118-119)
- (e) In lieu of the regulation Templar uniform, a Constituent Commandery may provide and use Ceremonial Robes conforming to and consistent with the historical traditions and practices of Templary. These Ceremonial Robes are to be used only in the Asylum for the conferring of the Order of the Temple and/or for the opening and closing of a Commandery of Knights Templar and their

design and material shall be approved by the Grand Commandery under which it is Chartered. (1940, p 257-315)

It is the responsibility of each Commander to read, understand and ensure compliance with Section 477 of the Grand Commandery of Illinois Constitution & Bylaws which specifies the uniform(s) of a Knight Templar. Each individual Commander of a Constituent Commandery in this Grand Commandery is personally responsible for ensuring each uniform worn by a member of his Commandery conforms to the requirements of Section 477.

During the Annual Inspection of a Constituent Commandery, should the uniform of either the Commander, Generalissimo, or Captain General be non compliant with the requirements of Section 477, the Commandery shall not be eligible to win any Divisional Honors for the Inspection year.

During the conferral of the Orders of Knighthood, the members participating in the ritualistic work shall be dressed as Knights Templar, wearing uniforms legalized by the Grand Commandery of that jurisdiction and the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America. (1961, p. 47, No. 16, Wiebe)

No Knight of Malta shall be created a Knight Templar in a Constituent Commandery unless when dubbed, he possesses the uniform prescribed by the Grand Commandery of Illinois or it shall be loaned to him by the Commandery for the purpose of the Ceremony. (Section 477, Grand Commandery Bylaws)

AUTHORIZED TEMPLAR JEWELS

On the standard uniform coat, Templar Jewels are to be worn from the left shoulder seam to the left lapel in the following order: Red Cross or Malta Jewel, as preferred, and honorary jewels ending with the highest jewel of office. The Malta Jewel must be worn on the uniform coat even if no other jewels are worn." Jewels are to be placed in a straight line even with the breast pocket and will not exceed the number that can be placed in the specified area of the uniform coat. No items, other than a name badge and the Grand Encampment jewels, authorized by the GEKT are to be worn on the right side of the uniform coat. Sir Knights wearing jewels in any other manner will be considered to be in violation of the laws of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar.

YORK CROSS OF HONOR JEWEL (KYCH)

The award of the Knights of the York Cross of Honor Jewel (KYCH) is a York Rite Honor; therefore, the KYCH Jewel should <u>never</u> be worn on the Knight Templar uniform. The only item that may be worn on the Templar uniform is one that has been authorized by the Grand Encampment or Grand Commandery uniform code. (Decision. 1955, page 97, No. 21, Gordon)

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR CROSS OF HONOR

The Knights Templar Cross of Honor for exceptional and meritorious service to the order was established by Section 237(b) of the Grand Encampment Statutes. This award can be awarded to only one Sir Knight in this jurisdiction and previous nominations shall be resubmitted during the current year. All nominations shall be submitted to the Grand Commander no later than **April 1**, 2021.

G. WILBUR BELL EXCALIBUR AWARD

This award can be awarded to two Sir Knights in this jurisdiction and previous nominations shall be resubmitted during the current year. All nominations shall be submitted to the Grand Commander no later than **April 1, 2021**.

GRAND COMMANDERY MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL

The Grand Commandery Meritorious Service Medal (MSM) award is available to all Commanderies to award to their worthy members. This is not a Grand Encampment award so, if awarded, it is to be worn on the left side of the uniform coat in line with other jewels. Only one such award per Commandery may be awarded in a calendar year. Each Constituent Commandery has the option of awarding this medal. This award is available from the Grand Recorder for a cost of \$100 each (plus shipping) to be paid by the Commandery.

PAST COMMANDER CROSS AND CROWN AWARD

As an incentive and encouragement to the Dais Officers to actively complete the three dais positions and provide the expectations of leadership of their offices, the Grand Commandery has developed a Past Commander Cross and Crown Award program. The Cross and Crown Award program will issue, through the Grand Recorder, Green Certificates of Completion for the positions of Captain General and Generalissimo after the Inspecting Officer has notified the Grand Recorder of the successful completion of the work done by the office holders. The Grand Recorder will also issue a Gold Certificate to the Commander after the Inspecting Officer has notified the Grand Recorder of the successful completion of the work done by the Commander. The Past Commander Awards will be issued to the Past Commander after a certification of successful completion of their assigned positions from the Constituent Commandery's Recorder, along with copies of the Certificates are received by the Grand Recorder and reviewed/approved by the Grand Commander. The successful recipients of the Past Commander Award will be recognized and will receive their awards at the Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery. The Past Commander Award criteria is posted on the Grand Commandery Web Page.

GRAND COMMANDERY OF ILLINOIS MEMBERSHIP JEWEL

The Grand Commandery Membership Jewel, if awarded, must be worn on the left side of the dress uniform in the single row of jewels as described in our Bylaws.

GRAND ENCAMPMENT MEMBERSHIP JEWEL

The Grand Encampment Membership Jewel, if awarded, may be worn on the left or right side of the dress uniform. If worn on the left side, the jewel must be part of the single row of jewels as described in our Bylaws.

GENERAL ORDER NO. 4 (A.E. Smith)
PER DIEM AND MILEAGE REIMBURSEMENT FOR TRAVEL ON OFFICIAL BUSINESS
1 September 2020

To the Officers of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. GREETINGS:

For purposes of this policy, official business travel includes hotel accommodations when authorized and is defined as:

- a. Travel to/from a meeting called by the REGC (unless travel is in conjunction with another event where expenses are already being reimbursed) or the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar.
- b. Travel by the Inspecting Officer to/from an annual Commandery Inspection as defined by Grand Commandery Bylaws. Only authorized when travel is over 200 miles one way. A Grand Commandery Officer who is authorized official travel by a privately owned vehicle (POV) is allowed one night of hotel accommodations for every 200 miles (one way) between authorized points. The distance between authorized points is calculated using shortest route identified by Google Maps or other such calculators.
- c. Travel required by Section 114b of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar, specifically by the REGC, VEDGC, EGG, EGCG and the EGR to the East Central Department Conference of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar.
 - d. Other travel specifically approved by the REGC.

The U. S. Internal Revenue Service (IRS) issues annually the standard mileage rate for operating an automobile for business. This rate will be used until the IRS rate changes, at which time a recalculated mileage reimbursement rate will also then be effective. The rate for use by the Grand Commandery will be determined by multiplying the IRS rate by 2/3rds (66%) rounded to the nearest whole cent.

Travel reimbursement requests must be submitted on a standard form and approved by the VEDGC and REGC and then filed with the EGT for payment. Receipts are required for all expenses exceeding \$50.00 and must not be more than 90 days old.

GENERAL ORDER NO. 6 - Amended (A.F. Smith) REOPENING TEMPLARY IN ILLINOIS 1 April 2021

To the Officers and Members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois. GREETINGS:

Under the guidelines of the Grand Master's GO#14, Reopening 2021 Safety Protocols, Nov. 1, 2020. I am declaring the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois to be in Phase Two for the purpose of Ritual Work only (see paragraph 4 of GO#14 Safety Protocols).

Effective 15 May 2021, I am authorizing all Commanders of Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois to consider their Commanderies open for business, including in-person conclaves and the conferring of the 3 Orders of Templary on qualified candidates. Division Inspecting Officers should insure a minimum of at least one Templar Day within each Division to confer the Order of the Temple.

The Commander shall use the following Safety Protocols when conducting in-person conclaves:

- a. All Sir Knights and candidates within the asylum shall have received full vaccinations and specifically state their understanding that attendance is voluntary.
- b. Attendance within the asylum shall not exceed 50.
- c. All Sir Knights and candidates shall wear face masks when moving around the asylum or when within six feet of each other, including during ritual.
- d. During the conferral of the Orders, the Commander is responsible for ensuring the use of standard Grand Encampment ritual; however, he is authorized to adapt the tactics of the Grand Commandery of Illinois to ensure compliance with all prudent mitigation steps based on his judgment.
- e. No "Ladies" program permitted and no food served.
- f. The Commander shall ensure compliance with Grand Encampment GO#14 Safety Protocols with the exception of actions outlined in "a d" above.

Members and candidates who are concerned about their health and safety should not attend the Conclaves. No "virtual" attendance permitted during any ritual.

As of the issuance of this order, all regions of the State of Illinois are in Phase Four with gatherings limited to 50 or less attendees (https://coronavirus.illinois.gov/s/restore-illinois-regional-dashboard). Should the Governor of Illinois change his restrictions from the current Phase Four, Commanders shall comply with whatever restrictions are imposed.

Commandery Recorders shall update MMS with the new Knight's information as soon as possible after the Orders are conferred.

To the Officers and Members of the Grand and Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

GREETINGS:

165th ANNUAL CONCLAVE

The 165th Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois shall be held in the City of Normal, Illinois, on Friday, 30 July 2021. The Grand Commandery shall convene at the Marriott Hotel and Convention Center, 201 Broadway Ave., Normal, Illinois 61761, at 8:30 A.M. for the opening session and will continue, with a recess for lunch, until business is concluded. The Election of Officers shall be called for on this day at an hour to be set by vote of the Grand Commandery immediately after it is convened.

HEADQUARTERS

Headquarters for the Grand Commander, the Grand Recorder, and all Committees shall be the Marriott Hotel and Convention Center, Normal, Illinois. The Credentials Committee shall be open on Friday, 30 July 2021, between the hours of 7:00 A.M. and 10:00 A.M. for the registration of Grand Commandery Officers, Past Grand Commanders, Commanders, Generalissimos, Captain Generals, Past Commanders, and all Sir Knights of Constituent Commanderies. Any Sir Knight holding a proxy shall present it at the time of registration. Each Illinois Sir Knight shall be required to show his current Dues Card at the time of registration. REGISTRATION WILL CLOSE AT 10:00 A.M. SHARP.

ATTENDANCE AT CONCLAVE

It is the duty of the Commander, Generalissimo, and Captain General of each Constituent Commandery to be present at the Grand Conclave, and such attendance is required by Section 67 of the Grand Encampment Code. Sir Knight John M. Sansone, Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander, is the Attendance Officer for this Grand Conclave and, as such, shall report on attendance of all Dais Officers of Constituent Commanderies.

PROXIES

In the event the Commander, Generalissimo, and Captain General of a Constituent Commandery is unable to attend the Grand Commandery Conclave in person, each may appoint as his proxy a member in good standing of the same Constituent Commandery. Such proxy does not, by virtue of the appointment, become a member of this Grand

Commandery.

The Grand Recorder has mailed three proxy forms to each Commandery, which must be filled out, signed by the officer appointing the proxy, and bear the seal of the Commandery; and thus, the proxy should be prepared before you leave home. The proxy must be filed with the Credentials Committee at the time of registration.

ROLL CALL

The Grand Recorder shall call the roll of the Grand Representatives from Illinois to other Grand Jurisdictions.

VOTING

All Grand Commandery members in good standing, present in person or by proxy, SHALL HAVE ONLY ONE VOTE. A current member of the Grand Commandery holding a proxy for another member of the Grand Commandery shall have only one vote. For a Sir Knight to be eligible to vote, the Sir Knight shall be a member of at least one Constituent Commandery that is not in arrears in payments owed to the Grand Commandery.

UNIFORMS

During all sessions of the Annual Conclave, Grand Officers and all Constituent Commandery current or past elected officers (Commander, Generalissimo and Captain General) shall wear full "Class A" Dress Templar Uniform, including Illinois regulation head-covering, black shoes and socks, and white gloves. Swords are only required to be worn by Grand Officers and those participating as escorts. At the Thursday evening Combined Grand Awards Dinner, Sir Knights may wear business casual, coat & tie preferred. At the Friday evening Gala Dinner, Sir Knights should wear Tuxedo or dark business suit.

During all sessions of the Annual Conclave, Sir Knights who are not current or past elected officers may wear either the full "Class A" Dress Templar Uniform, including Illinois regulation head-covering, black shoes and socks, and white gloves; the Illinois regulation Summer Uniform; the Illinois regulation Cap & Mantle (white long sleeve shirt, white cotton gloves, black pants, black socks and black shoes), or business casual with coat & tie. At the Thursday evening Combined Grand Awards Dinner, Sir Knights may wear business casual, coat & tie preferred. At the Friday evening Gala Dinner, Sir Knights should wear Tuxedo or dark business suit.

Section 463 of the Bylaws of the Grand Commandery of Illinois reads in part as follows regarding consumption of alcoholic beverages while in Templar uniform:

"Such use while in Templar uniform, either in whole or in part, (or approval) at any banquet, social, or other function given by, under the auspices of, or for the benefit of Knights Templar, is likewise prohibited and shall subject every offender to discipline."

BE IT RESOLVED that Section 411 of the Statutes of the Grand Commandery of knights Templar of the State of Illinois be amended by changing the word "Committee" to read "Committees" in the second sentence of the paragraph.

If amended, Section 415(L) would read:

L. Keep in the books provided for that purpose, a copy of the Coat of Arms and Seal of each constituent Commandery of the Grand Commandery of Knight Templar of Illinois;

BE IT RESOLVED that Section 415P is amended to change the word "Amount" in the first sentence to read "amount" and change the word "charted" to read "chartered"

Section 415P current reads:

Receive as his sole compensation payable by the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois for the performance of his duties an Amount determined by the following formula: \$50.00 for each charted Commandery, plus \$1.00 for each member, including dual members, as of December 31 of each fiscal year of the Grand Commandery. An estimate of the amount of compensation shall be included in the annual budget approved at the Annual Conclave, with final determination of the compensation made as soon as the records as of December 31 are available. (2013)

If amended, Section 415P would read:

P. Receive as his sole compensation payable by the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois for the performance of his duties an amount determined by the following formula: \$50.00 for each chartered Commandery, plus \$1.00 for each member, including dual members, as of December 31 of each fiscal year of the Grand Commandery. An estimate of the amount of compensation shall be included in the annual budget approved at the Annual Conclave, with final determination of the compensation made as soon as the records as of December 31 are available. (2013)

BE IT RESOLVED that Section 417(D) be amended to add "Standing Committees;" following the word "Perennial" in first sentence.

This policyshould include Hired and Non-Owned Auto insurance in the same amount. A certificate of insurance may be required to be produced at the annual inspection of the Commandery. (2019)

Each Constituent Commandery shall carry property insurance on its paraphernalia, equipment, and other property as listed in the Annual Report and Inventory in such amounts as recommended by the Finance Board and general liability insurance in an amount of at least One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) annual aggregate. The mantle shall have a single red ribbon, one inch wide stitched one half inch from the outer edge; the hood to be lined with similar red material; the Passion Cross in red with gold rays, nine inches in height, on the left breast; the mantle to tie closely around the neck with red cords with red tassels.

<u>Past Grand Commanders:</u> The mantle shall have a single purple ribbon, two inches wide, stitched one inch from the outer edge; the hood lined in purple in similar material; the Templar cross in purple nine inches in height on the left breast; the mantle to tie closely around the neck with purple cords with purple tassels.

The EC moves to within one pace of the candidate, kneels, and instructs candidate to uncover (with left hand) and deposits chapeau with cross up or cap or garrison cap, crown side down, cross facing the wearer and interlace fingers.

Proposed amendment to SECTION 449 of the STATUTES OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY OF KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

As currently written:

SECTION 449. Jurisdiction of all Commanderies in the State of Illinois shall be concurrent. By concurrent jurisdiction is meant that the territorial jurisdiction exercised by one Commandery is the common property of all Commanderies in the State. Any Commandery may receive the petition of any duly qualified Royal Arch Mason residing in the State of Illinois and act thereon.

As it would read, if amended:

SECTION 449. Jurisdiction of all Commanderies in the State of Illinois shall be concurrent. By concurrent jurisdiction is meant that the territorial jurisdiction exercised by one Commandery is the common property of all Commanderies in the State. Any Commandery may receive the petition of any duly qualified Cryptic Mason residing in the State of Illinois and act thereon.

Justification:

As the State of Illinois has three primary York Rite bodies, and as membership in Cryptic Masonry requires membership in a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, and as Illinois strives to function as a unified York Rite, it is only fitting that membership in a Commandery of Knights Templar require that a candidate be a member of both preceding York Rite bodies, namely a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons <u>AND</u> a Council of Cryptic Masons, in order to petition for the Orders of Knighthood.

CIRCULAR NO. 1 (A.E. Smith) CONDUCT ON SOCIAL MEDIA 1 September 2020

To the Officers and Members of the Grand and Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

GREETING:

- 1. The importance of social media platforms such as Facebook, Twitter and others are undeniable in the recruiting efforts of our Grand Commandery. Social Media is also an excellent tool for distributing information about the Masonic Knights Templar fraternity. Unfortunately, some people seem to take advantage of the "anonymous" nature of social media and feel free to post hateful, misleading and untrue comments. Therefore, I have outlined below my policies regarding postings on the official Facebook page of our Grand Commandery and the standards of conduct I expect of our members in the use of social media.
- 2. During my term as Grand Commander of The Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois, the policies as outlined below constitutes my expectations for the conduct by men who represent themselves as a member of this Grand Commandery, notwithstanding my strongest respect for our freedom of speech and expression provided by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution. It is expected that every Sir Knight under this Grand Commandery's jurisdiction conduct himself at all times as outlined in the following policies, when communicating via social media or when speaking publically.
- 3. For the purpose of these policies, "social media" means blogs, wikis, micro-blogs, message boards, chat rooms, electronic newsletters, online forums, social networking sites, and other sites and services that permit users to share information with others in a contemporaneous manner. "Speaking publically" means the Sir Knight is either in a Templar uniform or wearing clothing that could infer that he is a Knight Templar.
- 4. A Sir Knight should always be aware that all social media communications are permanent and may be made public, even if deleted. A Sir Knight should always conduct himself by the high standards of integrity to which he is held by his obligations. He is never to let fall the least sign, token or word whereby the secrets of Templary or Freemasonry may be unlawfully obtained. It is expected that these charges are to be observed in a Sir Knight's daily conduct as well as his online interactions.
 - a. Comply with and conform to laws, statutes and bylaws of a Sir Knight as printed in the Constitution & By-Laws of both the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois and of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States.

- b. Reflect positively on the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois, its charities and foundations.
- c. Not contain content or commentary that is derogatory, inflammatory, antagonistic, bullying, confidential, defamatory, harassing, offensive, pornographic or profane.
- d. Not contain a third party's copyrighted material, trademarks, service marks or other protected material unless legally authorized.
- e. Not allow the ritual of the Grand Lodge of Illinois, Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois nor the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar to be quoted or outlined in any manner which would allow the uninitiated to receive information, rights, or benefits to which he is not legally entitled.
- f. Not divulge information about the business of a tiled asylum with any non-Sir Knights, for it is considered a violation of the sacred trust with which each Sir Knight is charged.
- g. Not share a brother's personal information in any form of social media without his prior consent.
- h. Not contain discussions about a candidate's petition, balloting, background, or orders beyond notices of these events taking place.
- i. Not contain dishonorable content such as, but not limited to, racial, ethnic, sexual, religious, and physical disability slurs.
- j. Not contain any message, posting, video, or other form of communication that does not conform to established Grand Commandery bylaws and edicts.
- 5. Violation of these guidelines may be considered in determining whether such posts constitute inappropriate conduct and subject the offender to suffer the penalties therefor as authorized by the Policies, Bylaws and Statutes of this Grand Commandery and of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar.

POLICY ON MEETINGS AND PUBLIC ASSEMBLY IN UNIFORM
1 November 2020

To the Officers and Members of the Grand and Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

GREETING:

- 1. GRAND COMMANDERY OFFICER MEETINGS: There will be several Grand Commandery Officers' official meetings during the year, normally conjunction with a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Illinois Knights Templar Home. Attendance by officers of the "advancing line" is required and attendance by REPGC's is always encouraged. Schedule and location of the meetings will be announced in advance for planning purposes.
- 2. REGC'S CHRISTMAS PARTY: The tradition of having REGC's Christmas Party and gift exchange is suspended for the Command year of 2020 due to the COVID-19 restrictions. There should be no Christmas "gift" for the REGC or his Lady.
- 3. CHRISTMAS LIBATIONS: The tradition of having Christmas Libations is suspended for the Command year of 2020 due to the COVID-19 restrictions.
- 4. COMMAND GALA: The REPGC will host a semi-formal "Command Gala" dinner on the evening following the end of the Annual Conclave in 2021, COVID-19 restrictions permitting. The location will be determined approximately 1 month prior to the Sessions and invitations sent to attendees.
- 5. PUBLIC ASSEMBLY, VISITS AND ESCORTS: Dispensation is hereby granted to all Commanderies under the jurisdiction of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of The State of Illinois to appear in public in full Templar Dress Uniform and in suitable numbers to present a proper appearance within this jurisdiction, specifically for attendance at Divine Services, Funerals, Escort Duties to other Masonic Bodies where authorized, Scottish Rite Reunions and Public Parades, provided the REGC is notified no later than 15 days prior to the event. In all cases, other than parades, all Sir Knights must be dressed uniformly. In the case of a parade, each Commandery marching as a separate unit must be dressed uniformly. Public assembly in Templar uniform for any purpose not described above requires a formal Dispensation from the Grand

Commander. At all Templar assemblies outlined above, all Sir Knights will comply with the

COVID-19 restrictions imposed by local and state government officials

CIRCULAR NO. 3 (A. E. Smith) ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES 1 November 2020

To the Officers and Members of the Grand and Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

GREETING:

- 1. DEMITS: All requests for demits are to be reviewed by the Eminent Commander who shall appoint a Committee to make a personal contact with the Sir Knight requesting the demit. After being contacted by the Committee, the demit will then be issued providing the Sir Knight is clear on the books of the Commandery. No dues are to be collected after the date of the demit.
- 2. SUSPENSIONS: Suspensions of members of a Commandery, due to being in arrears for dues and/or other indebtedness, are to be made in compliance with Sections 460 and 460B of the Statutes of the Grand Commandery of the State of Illinois. At the first Stated Conclave of the Commandery in October the Recorder shall report to the Commandery the names of all of the Sir Knights subject to suspension. The Commandery has the right to remit the dues of those Sir Knights in arrears when the Sir Knight is judged unable to comply due to illness, infirmity, or financial inability. Those instances of compassion demonstrate pure Templar benevolence. The Commander will appoint a Committee to make personal contact with the Sir Knight in question to determine how his membership can be continued. The Recorder will complete "Report to the Grand Commandery on Members subject to Suspension" sending copies to the Grand Recorder. All proceedings are to be made a part of the minutes of the Stated Conclave in October. If no report is received back from the Headquarters of the Grand Commandery, you may proceed with the action of suspending the Sir Knight from the Commandery.
- 3. DISPENSATIONS: Dispensations may be issued upon request as authorized by the Statutes of the Grand Commandery of the State of Illinois. The Commander shall make such request over his signature and bearing the Seal of the Commandery. All requests shall specify the date of the action and provide all pertinent information necessary for evaluation. The request must be forwarded to the Grand Commander with an appropriate time interval for his review and reply. After issuance, the original copy of the dispensation will be promptly returned to the Grand Commander with a full report of the action taken. The actions of the Commandery will be regularly recorded in the minutes of the Commandery.

- 4. FIFTY-YEAR PRESENTATIONS: Every Knight Templar who has been in good standing without interruption for a period of fifty (50) years will be recognized with a fifty-year membership card and pin and shall not be required to pay any further dues to his Commandery. It is the responsibility of the Recorder of each Commandery to notify the Grand Recorder who will forward the card and pin to the Commandery for presentation on the anniversary date. The Grand Commander will be notified by the Grand Recorder and will make the presentation if circumstances and time permit; otherwise, it is suggested that the presentation be made at a suitable public or Fraternal function.
- 5. HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE MINISTER PROPOSALS: The ministers' applications must be submitted by <u>September 14, 2021</u>, to the Office of the Grand Recorder. The committee will be selecting the minister prior to <u>November 1, 2021</u>. The goal of the Grand Commandery is to have at least one minister per year participate in this memorable program if the Holy Land Pilgrimage Fund has enough money to send a minister.
- 6. TEMPLAR MEMORIALS: Upon the death of any member of a constitute Commandery in the State of Illinois, the Recorder of the deceased Member's Commandery is requested to send to the Grand Recorder's office a notification regarding the deceased member's name, including his address, next of kin's address, his date of birth and any other information pertaining to the Sir Knight. The Grand Recorder will respond with appropriate condolences to the bereaved family. The Recorder must also report the death in his MMS report, and/or the Monthly Report.

CIRCULAR NO. 4 (A. E. Smith)
GRAND COMMANDER'S DECISION
USE OF WINE DURING THE ORDER OF THE TEMPLE RITUAL
AND CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE WHILE IN TEMPLAR UNIFORM
1 August 2020

To the Officers and Members of the Grand and Constituent Commanderies of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois.

GREETING:

1. It is the philosophy of my command that we "Say what we mean; and mean what we say." Given this belief, this Circular is to clarify my decision regarding Section 463 of our Grand Commandery Bylaws, which I quote below:

"SECTION 463. The use or approval, either actual or tacit, of such use of spirituous, vinous or malt liquors as a beverage in an asylum of Knights Templar or on the grounds of a Masonic Temple during the time that any Order is being conferred therein is strictly prohibited and shall subject every offender to discipline. Such use while in Templar uniform, either in whole or in part, (or approval) at any banquet, social, or other function given by, under the auspices of, or for the benefit of Knights Templar, is likewise prohibited and shall subject every offender to discipline.(2018)."

2. I find no restrictions in the Grand Encampment Statutes that require the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois to enact the restrictions outlined in Section 463 that read:

"Such use while in Templar uniform, either in whole or in part, (or approval) at any banquet, social, or other function given by, under the auspices of, or for the benefit of Knights Templar, is likewise prohibited and shall subject every offender to discipline.(2018)."

3. Other than Section 463 of our Bylaws, I see no reason why, for example, an Illinois Knight Templar attending a Grand Encampment banquet in either semi-formal or formal attire outside

the State of Illinois cannot consume alcoholic beverages when other Knights Templar from other jurisdictions, perhaps sitting at the same table in uniform are free to do so. In my opinion, the wording of Section 463 is not intended to include members attending a social event in Evening Attire. At the next Annual Conclave I will propose a change to this Bylaw; in the meantime I grant a blanket dispensation for Sir Knights under the jurisdiction of this Grand Commandery, when attending social events outside the State of Illinois, to wear Tuxedo or formal evening attire (with no Knights Templar markings or jewels) if they plan to consume alcoholic beverages.

- 4. The Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Illinois, Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Illinois has written his interpretation of Code 485 of the Bylaws of the Grand Lodge and his interpretation does not prohibit renters/leasers (Templars) who rent space in a Lodge building from consuming alcoholic beverages in a social, dinner or banquet setting so long as a Lodge is not in session in that facility and the Lodge owning the building allows such use in their Bylaws.
- 5. Our Tactics during the First through the Fourth Libation of the Order of the Temple call for "water and wine." The Fifth Libation calls for "pure wine." Except for the ritualistic use of wine in the Order of the Temple, the use or approval, either actual or tacit, of spirituous, vinous or malt liquors as a beverage in an asylum of Knights Templar or on the grounds of a Masonic Temple while in Knights Templar uniform, is strictly prohibited and shall subject every offender to discipline. For example, "checking the vintage" by tasting the wine in the goblet on the Triangle Table prior to the beginning of the Libations while in any form of Templar uniform is prohibited! Likewise, Sir Knights in uniform shall not drink the wine in the unused goblets during Triangle breakdown.
- 6. TEMPLE BOARD RESTRICTIONS: Some Temple Boards prohibit the use of red wine in their Lodge facilities due to potential carpet damage in the event of an accidental spill. Commanderies should request permission from the Temple Board to substitute white wine. The Order of the Temple ritual does not require the wine to be "red."

Report on 2020-2021 Inspections

To: The Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois

The 2020-2021 Inspection Season was challenging for the Grand Commandery and the Constituent Commanderies of the State of Illinois. The Commanderies were prevented from meeting in person from April 2020 until May of 2021. Therefore, I was impossible to Inspect the Commanderies in any way that resembled "Normal" procedures. The Grand Commandery Officers decided to perform Division Level Inspections which could incorporate Short Form Orders of Red Cross and Malta, or a School of Instruction. A Book Inspection would be accomplished at these Division Inspections to be sure every Commandery was current as much as possible with the minimum functions to sustain legal status under the Constitution, Laws and Edicts of the Grand Commandery, Grand Encampment and IRS. No member would be forced to participate due to individual health restrictions, but each Commandery was required to participate in some form or another.

As simplified Inspection Report was developed to document the minimum actions taken by the Commanderies. Scores are for reference only as we chose not to penalize Commanderies for not being polished in ritual or where most of the members were in the high health risk category.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TREASURER

To the Officers and Members of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois,

The Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of the State of Illinois has the following funds, accounts, and investments:

- 1. General Checking Account. This checking account is now at US Bank and is used for payment of Grand Commandery Bills and as a pass-through account for other special accounts, such as the Life Membership Account and Phillips Charity Fund Account. Thus, you may see some liability from or to the General Fund and other funds. These liabilities are closed out periodically by transfers among the funds, and the liabilities shown in the attached reports were closed out in July 2021.
- **2. General Fund Investments.** Excess funds of the Grand Commandery are held in a managed investment account at Raymond James in Peoria, Illinois.
 - **3. Jones Permanent Fund.** This Fund was established in 2004 from funds remaining in the Fund for 2003 Triennial Expenses raised through an assessment. This is an endowment fund from which one-half of the income is available for general Grand Commandery Expenses. Contributions to this fund should be promoted to increase the fund as a permanent sustaining fund of the Grand Commandery.
- **4. Graff Memorial Fund**. This fund was established in about 2002 when Dottie Graff, wife of Richard L. Graff, Grand Recorder, died. The stipulation for this endowment fund is that the fund is to be increased by donations of memorials and accumulated income until the fund reaches \$20,000.00, after which income from the fund can be used for general Grand Commandery Expenses. The fund has reached \$20,000.00.
- 5. Eloise H. Phillips Charity Fund. This endowment fund is a separate investment account at Raymond James and was established in 1978 from a bequest to the Grand Commandery with a stipulation that the principal donated remain in the amount of \$116,114.98 and that only income be used for charitable purposes as specified in her Will.
- **6. Fiscal Officer's Fund**. This fund is also held in a separate investment account at Raymond James and was established to pay claims made by constituent Commanderies should a financial officer misappropriate funds. In essence this provides Commanderies protection against malfeasance or

- misfeasance by financial officers. No claim has been allowed on this fund and contributions to this fund were discontinued a few years ago.
- 7. Holy Land Pilgrimage Fund. This fund is held in a separate investment account at Raymond James and receives donations to pay for sending ministers to the Holy Land through the Grand Encampment Holy Land Pilgrimage program. Of the fund balance, \$4,000.00 is a restricted endowment.

The following proposal to update the Grand Commandery Tactics Manual was submitted (in 2020) to the Jurisprudence Committee for approval and vote at the next Conclave.

We would like to propose the following changes to the Grand Commandery Knights Templar Illinois Asylum Tactics. The only version I have found is dated 1989 so the wording may not match exactly with a more currant revision.

Upon the Commander's command to deposit chapeaus during the rehearsal and attributes. The following additions are proposed:

Opening

Rehearsal instructions on page 19.

Each Knight lays his chapeau, cross up or cap or garrison cap, crown side down, cross facing the wearer, on the floor, with his left hand, the tops of the chapeau or side of the cap or garrison cap opposite and touching.

Attributes

The grip and immaculate word page 92.

The EC moves to within one pace of the candidate, kneels, and instructs candidate to uncover (with left hand) and deposits chapeau with cross up or cap or garrison cap, crown side down, cross facing the wearer and interlace fingers.

The Knights Templar Eye Foundation 53rd Voluntary Campaign ran from June 1, 2020 through May 15, 2021. A Total of \$1,390,186.28 was realized by this Campaign from contributions by all Sir Knights and Commanderies. The Sir Knights of Illinois generously contributed \$30,605.93 to the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. Illinois placed 16th in the Grand Encampment for Contributions. Our Per Capita Contributions were \$10.34 per Sir Knight, and placed us 43rd in the Grand Encampment in that category.

The above mentioned Contributions plus Trusts and Will made the Grand Total to be \$2,158,267.08 and which was received by the Knights Templar Eye Foundation during the 53rd Voluntary Campaign. The Sir Knights and Commanderies of Illinois final Contributions plus Trusts and Wills totaled \$296,017.04. This placed Illinois **first** in total Contributions plus Trusts and Wills.
